BAPTISM

(You can download forms online or contact the parish office for a copy)

*Provide a copy of the child's state-issued birth certificate

*Have each godparent complete a godparent form
*Attend a baptism preparation class and ask the godparents to do the same. If individuals have attended the class previously (within the last three years) this requirement is met.

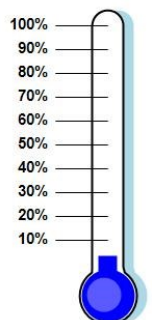

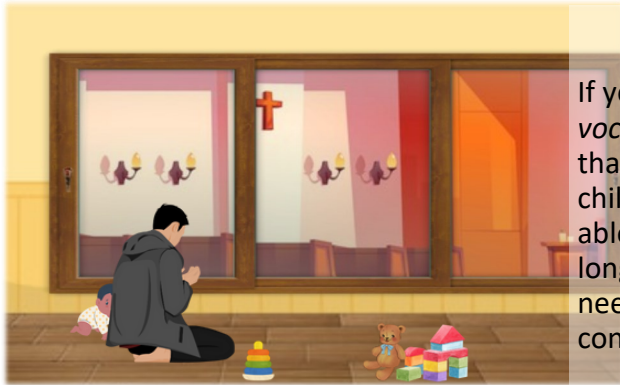

Can you help a neighbor?

The St. Benedict Conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society provides assistance to neighbors in the 98103 zip code. These individuals and families are literally your neighbors, your brothers and sisters in the Lord, some of whom are in desperate need of our help.

Over the last six months, we helped nearly 100 families with food, clothing, gas, bus fare, rent, and utility assistance. Most of our neighbors have housing and we work first to keep them in housing. St. Benedict's relationship with Family Works in Wallingford not only offers help to the housed but also the homeless. Orca cards assist neighbors with transportation to the food bank at Family Works, to go to a job interview, or visit a doctor's office. Something as small as an Orca card can change lives for the better.

The help we provide is reliant completely on parishioner support. Over the last six months, we averaged \$1,400 per month from parishioners. Our reserves are nearly exhausted, because this amount is well below the need. We have recently had to restrict our assistance to \$200 annually per family.

We appeal to you to help in this vital ministry. Our aim is to have many parishioners provide modest support on a continuous basis. Gifts can be given through the parish electronic portal, through envelopes available in pews, or in the envelope packets received monthly. Any amount will help. Please prayerfully consider how you can help your neighbors through the St. Vincent de Paul ministry at St. Benedict's.

Remember the Lord's words in Matthew 25:

For I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me....Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink?

'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'
