O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not hear? Or cry to you "Violence!" And you will not save? Why do you make me see wrongs and look upon trouble? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise. And the Lord answered me: "Write the vision; make it plain upon tablets, so he may run who reads it. For still the vision awaits its time; it hastens to the end— it will not lie. If it seem slow, wait for it; it will surely come, it will not delay.
