The ParishSoft website is fairly user friendly. Here are some screenshots to walk you through an example of how to amend your online giving.

1. After you log-in you see this screen:

2. If you click "Scheduled" you'll see this:

3. Then you click on the carrot "**^**" next to "Recurring" ...

...and it will open up a drop menu where you may click "**Edit**" and then you may edit or delete the recurring gift.

You should then see a screen similar to this (depending on whether you're on your phone, tablet, or computer).

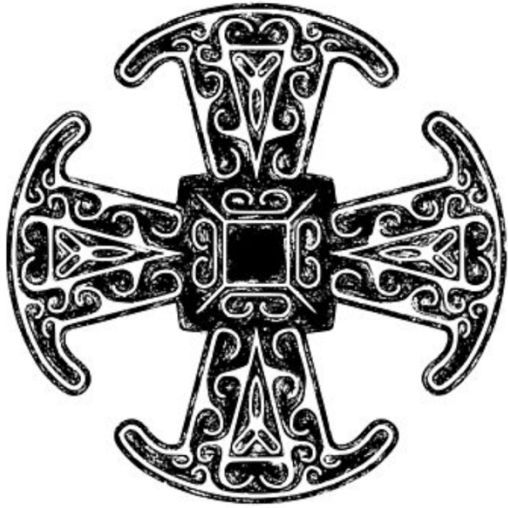
Then you can simply set up recurring giving as you desire.
