

A NOTE FROM FATHER DUDZINSKI



+JMJ+ "Walk with Jesus!"

Welcome to the holiest week of the year! "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." — Mt. 6:21 Are you "fired up for this week?" Let

me see if I can pique your interest!

Today we celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem! He enters the Holy City with the crowds waving palms and singing *Hosanna to God in the Highest!*

As Christians (Catholics) this week is very important for us to reflect on salvation history. We have the opportunity to enter into, and appreciate at a more profound level, all that Jesus did for us. As much as possible, it would be good to participate in this week's Masses and services, especially the Sacred Triduum. The Sacred Triduum (Sacred three days) consists of Holy Thursday (the Mass of the Lord's Supper), Good Friday (Jesus' death) and Easter (the Resurrection)!

This week we relive the last days of Jesus' life here on earth before He died for our sins! I want to emphasize: we relive the last days. I emphasize this because the Church is recalling, to the best of her ability, what happened during these days. We receive palms on Palm Sunday and walk through the Passion narrative so as to enter into this week with a heightened awareness of this most important event. His entrance into Jerusalem has us hearing with amazement the glorious reception He receives and then how quickly, less than a week later, the crowds turn on Him.

The Masses on Monday—Wednesday focus on the greed of Judas and his subsequent betrayal of Jesus; Peter's predicted denial of Jesus three times before the rooster crowed. Wednesday is often referred to as "spy" Wednesday because that is when he betrayed Jesus for 30 pieces of silver and started looking for the right moment to hand Jesus over to the Jewish leaders.

This week comes to its pinnacle during the Sacred Triduum. Holy Thursday at the Mass of the Lord's Supper Jesus institutes the Eucharist and the priesthood. These two events are very important in the Church because the Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our Faith, and without the priesthood we do not have the Eucharist or the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Another highlight of this liturgy is the *washing of the feet*. This traditionally is done with 12 men of the parish signifying the 12 apostles whose feet Jesus washed during this meal. Jesus also gave the command that they were to imitate Him in the service of others when He said, "I came to serve and not to be served." This command is modeled by the apostles so that we can then go out and do the same! Another beautiful thing that happens at the end of the Mass is that all those gathered process to a place (the parish hall) which reflects the *Garden of Gethsemane*. *All* are invited to spend time there in prayer with Jesus until He is arrested at midnight.

The **Good Friday** service is not a Mass, but a three-fold commemoration of the **Passion Narrative**, the **Veneration of the Cross** and a **Communion Service**. This is a very powerful and moving liturgy, *that is a must*, if we are going to appreciate Jesus dying for our sins.

Holy Saturday is a somber day in which we reflect on these events and then celebrate the Resurrection at the Easter Vigil or on Easter Sunday!!! Praise God for these days! Please take advantage and participate, or at least reflect on the profoundness of each of these days!

St. Maria Goretti... pray for us!


DID YOU KNOW?



WHAT IS THE ROSES FOR LIFE PROGRAM?

Roses for Life was initiated by an SMG couple who were so grateful for the prayers they received at another parish during their high-risk pregnancies that they wanted to establish a way to pray for mothers and their babies here at SMG, so they created the Roses for Life program for expectant mothers.

Each cream-colored rose, placed in the nave by the statue of Mary, represents a mom who is expecting a baby, either by pregnancy or adoption.

Everyone is asked to pray for these moms and their babies.



The roses serve as a reminder to the mothers that the parish is praying for them. Each rose has the name of the mother and/or family, as well as the baby's due date. When the baby is born or adopted, the mother may take the rose as a keepsake. 


The HOPE Family Care Center is a free clinic providing professional health and dental care for the un-Family Care Center insured and medically under-




