





Going on Mission as Eucharistic People

o one can deny the division in our world and in our country. We all need healing, yet many of us are separated from the very source of our strength and communion. We believe the solution is to respond to Christ's invitation to unite with Him and all brothers and sisters in Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

- This past year, there were 12,095 confirmed visits to Eucharistic Adoration, a 27% increase over the previous year.
- We hosted monthly hours of guided Eucharistic Adoration through our Encounter Jesus nights, where parishioners experienced moments of personal encounter with Christ.





- We participated in the first-ever National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, processing with and hosting pilgrims on the Marian Route which began in Bemidjii, MN and ended in Lucas Oil Stadium at the National Eucharistic Congress.
- ♠ Over 100 parishioners participated in the 10th National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis from July 17-21, 2024, a historic moment for the Catholic Church in the U.S., and the first such Congress in 83 years.

A Place for All Who Seek

we ministered to a record number of people this past year – people who are searching for communion with our Lord and for a deeper meaning in their lives.

- We welcomed 9,118 total people to our Christmas and Easter Masses, representing an all-time high and a 21% increase over the previous year.
- The rate of growth in the number of registered parish families continues to increase, with over 20 new families registering each month.
- We've had 45 adults have enter into full communion with the Church through our OCIA process at the Easter Vigil Mass over the past two years; the most people over a two-year period since 2013-2014.





- We are experiencing an increased demand in our school and growing waitlist.
- Our Holy Name Society men's group saw a 29% increase in attendance at their weekly Tuesday morning formation gatherings where they seek to grow in faith and virtue along other men of faith.
- Attendees to our Middle and High School youth groups nights increased nearly 45% over last year.
- Average attendance to Faith and Froth grew by over 65% and our Adult Bible Study attendance grew by more than 25% over the past year.
- We accompanied 24 people through a 15-week bereavement workshop as part of our new Our Lady of Hope Bereavement Ministry.





Improving our Campus for Mission

We recognize the important role our campus plays in allowing us to carry out the mission Christ has given us. As stewards of God's gifts to us, we have focused on properly maintaining our existing facilities and grounds, and making improvements to our campus for the sake of that mission.

- Constructed our new Frassati Commons outdoor concession and restroom facility and communal gathering space using Spring Fling Gala funds from 2023-2024.
- Installed new flooring in our classrooms, parish kitchen, and Shepherd's Gate Food Pantry using 2024 Catholic Ministries Appeal funds.
- Renovated the school playground with new mulch, basketball hoops, and basketball court lines using 2025 School Day of Giving funds.
- Enhanced campus security through the addition of a new playground fence, additional security cameras, and an integrated security communication platform using both offertory and funds received through a state grant.
- Replaced the original chiller and upgraded controls for our church HVAC system using both offertory and 2025 Spring Fling Gala funds.
- Repaved and restriped the north parking lot using parish cash reserves.

Deepening Discipleship

We're investing in our commitment to forming disciples at every age and stage of life through a variety of practical and accessible opportunities and resources that help parishioners grow in faith—both within the parish and at home. One key effort is our *Prayerful Home* initiative - smgonline.org/prayerfulhome - which places free faith-building tools into the hands of families to encourage spiritual growth throughout the week.

Enhanced Safety & Security

We are making significant investments to ensure a safer environment for our school and parish community:

- Upgraded Facilities: We will further improve our campus infrastructure, allowing us to better secure all entrances to the church and school buildings. This will bring our total investment in security upgrades since 2020 to over \$175,000.
- Expanded Safety Team: We're increasing the presence of safety staff and volunteers at Masses to help ensure a calm, watchful, and welcoming environment.
- Professional Support: We are adding paid law enforcement officers to provide an additional layer of protection during school Masses.

Weekly Offertory Budget

Increase in Staff & Teacher Wages

We have increased wages & benefits.

Increased Utility Costs

Primarily due to an increase in electricity and natural gas costs.

Next Stage of Campus Security & Safety Upgrades

\$35,000

Door upgrades to assist in preventing unwanted access in our buildings.

Over the next 6 years, we anticipate major capital replacement costs will exceed \$825,000.
