Twinning:

Pew Crew Reactivated to Purchase New Printer for St. John/St. Lewis Office

In spite of the recent lockdown and a few serious health issues, members of the original *Pew Crew* came together once again to help with another project for our friends in Dominica. Parish members Thom Baker, Ron Miller, Jerry Voisinet, and Bob Hartings organized back in 2016 to travel to Kansas to gather pew seating for 500; the pews were transported back to Piqua, prepped, and shipped to St. John/St. Lewis in Dominica for the new church. This same team plus Thom's sons, Adam and Matthew, completed another recent effort.



A significant item donation was made to the Mission Commission back in early 2019 and rather than try to sell the item at the annual Rummage Sale, it was decided to put the item up for sale on the internet. (Note: Since the unique item was donated anonymously, we opted not to elaborate here.) Multiple inquiries came forward and the item was sold for \$1,000! Thom, Adam, and Matthew created unique crates to house and transport the item that had been donated. It has now been shipped and is close to arriving at its final destination.

The proceeds from that sale, plus another \$1,000 from the Mission Committee, have been sent to Father Elveau, pastor of St. John and St. Lewis Parish in Dominica and Judith Margaret Alexis, Parish Secretary. Father and Judith (see photo) have been attempting to revitalize their very old printer that has been in use for many years. After several

months of trying to find parts to keep it running, it was discovered that key parts are no longer being made. After discussion with Don Stonerock, President of the Mission Committee, it was decided to use the \$1,000 from the proceeds of this project plus another \$1,000 from the Mission Committee treasury to purchase the printer that was so desperately needed for the parish and the school. Thanks go out to Theresa Henderson for a wire transfer to quickly transfer the funds to the Parish's checking account.

Please note the refurbished cross in the back. As the copper ages, it will change in patina to the same tone that shows on the steeple which was completed several years ago with copper.

St. Mary's Church Being Redecorated by Great Artist

Within a short time, the members of the St. Mary's Church will have an edifice that will equal any in this section of the country in interior beauty. The entire interior is being redecorated under the masterful touch of E. Piene, of Cincinnati, regarded by many as one of the greatest interior decorators in the country.

The ceiling has been painted an ivory color with a beamed ceiling effect. The walls are a gray stone effect finished in a very realistic manner. Fourteen group stations of the cross, finished in cream and gold to harmonize with the color scheme of the church, will be placed along the sides. The floor of the church is to be covered with a cork carpet.

Mr. Piene and his assistants are working hard to finish the altars and sanctuary as far as possible by Sunday, but it will be two or three weeks yet before all of the pews are completed.
