# Tending The Master's Vineyard





In 2014, I received permission to spend my three-month sabbatical in Hawaii studying the two great Hawaiian saints: St. Damien of Molokai and St. Mother Cope. God poured down so many graces on my sabbatical. I would like to share a couple of those amazing stories.

The first amazing gift from God happened during my preparation for the trip. I was looking through the internet for places to go and activities to do on my pilgrimage. I found a site called, "A Catholic Mom in Hawaii." I enjoyed looking at the posts, so I decided to send a message. In the return message, Esther told me that she and her friends love to show visiting priests around the island. Esther and her friend, Lois, took good care of me during my time on Oahu, and for that I continue to thank God for arranging some generous and faith-filled guides.

The second great gift from God flows directly from the first one. Esther had asked if I wanted to go to Lois' for dinner, and I agreed. So Lois sent a text to her husband, or so she thought, but she accidentally sent it to their friends. The Garcia family showed up for dinner, and God blessed me abundantly with their friendship, as we hit it off right from the start. They took me out regularly and showed me some great places to hang out and enjoy all that Hawaii has to offer. One of those activities involved shark diving off the north shore of Oahu. What an exhilarating day, as several sharks came up to our cage, and I got many awesome pictures. We went whale watching and searching the beaches for the Hawaiian Green Sea Turtle and the Monk Seals. But, they also introduced me to their pastor, and I was able to celebrate many Masses and meet so many amazing people.

While I had lots of fun with the shark diving, scuba diving, whale watching, and just hanging on the beautiful beaches, I also had the great privilege of going to Molokai with Bishop Silva of Honolulu for the feast day of St. Mother Cope. St. Mother Cope and St. Damien of Molokai worked tirelessly in the mid to late 19<sup>th</sup> century to bring dignity to the individuals isolated on the northern peninsula of Molokai as a result of contracting leprosy. St. Damien eventually died from the disease, while St. Cope was free from the dis-

ease. On this trip to Kalaupapa (the name of the peninsula on Molokai) I met several extended members of St. Mother Cope's family, to include her great, great niece and great, great, great nephew.

But the real grace of the day was Bishop Silva's homily on the great works of charity of these two great saints. I pray that we can all learn from the great work of these two saints and work tirelessly to elevate the dignity of the marginalized of our society. But even more so, to elevate the faith in God of all we meet this day.

God is good all the time.

# School News—CFEL—PCS—LCHS





## Thank You for Your Kindness & Concern



Back in June — June 15, 2022 — I was taken to Kettering Grandview Hospital for a pacemaker. For two weeks prior to this date, I was very tired, but thinking I was over doing some things, I didn't give a thought to it. The next week and a half I started to have shortness of breath and dizziness when I would go up a step or more.

The morning of June 15, I went to church to serve at Mass, and when I walked up the front steps, I had to sit down once inside. I was short of breath and dizzy. Once I got over it, I served, locked up the church, and went home.

I'm thinking I have a lung infection. Gloria called the doctor, and I drove out to the doctor's office at Kettering Health here in Piqua. They gave me an EKG and checked my chest compressions.

The next thing I know the doctor walks in and says, "See that wheelchair? That's for you. We are taking you to emergency." I asked if I could take the car home to Gloria. The answer was "No!"

My heartbeat was 29 and according to medical diagnosis I should have been unconscious or dead. I'm 75 years old and had never been in the hospital since birth. They contacted Gloria, and she found a way to have someone bring her out to get the car. Father Dan anointed me and was quite shocked to see me since I had just served at Mass. I was then transported to Kettering Grandview and told that a pacemaker would be put in. They put a temporary one in since another gentleman came in the same time as me and was failing fast. I received a permanent one the next day. The doctor told me due to my age that my heart was wearing out.

But, God was with me. I would not have thought that I was having heart trouble. Even though the doctors and nurses were amazed at me by being alert. I know that if God wouldn't have been with me I would have been unconscious or dead.

So, I would like to tell everyone, that if you ever feel really tired or get out of breath and dizzy go to the doctor immediately. It could be your heart. There are a lot of limitations I have now, but I'm grateful to be alive. It's really hard to be limited when you are so used to being so active.

I am grateful for all the cards, phone calls, and prayers that the two parishes showed me.
