
# Tending the Master's Vineyard





I recently received an email from Archbishop Schnurr with a bit of an odd question. Here is a portion of that email: "Yesterday Bishop Kevin Rhoades, the Bishop of Fort Wayne-South Bend, was the commencement speaker for graduation at the Athenaeum. He did a fantastic job. He asked about Piqua because the first bishop of Fort Wayne-South Bend was born in Piqua. He asked whether the memory of Bishop Luers is alive in Piqua. I told him that I did not know, but I would ask the pastor. Thus, this e-mail."

So I asked a dear friend to do some research for me and this is what we found about the first bishop of Fort Wayne-South Bend.

Bishop John Henry Luers was born in Germany, near the city of Munster in 1819. His family moved to the United States of America in 1833, landing in New York on June 7<sup>th</sup>. The family then moved to Piqua and settled on a farm near the city. John found work as a clerk and assistant salesman in a store in Piqua. He was noted for strict integrity and attention to business.

Unfortunately, he began to neglect his spiritual life. The bishop later in his life recounted a story in which his father reminded him of the importance of faith. "The subsequent interview between my father and myself was of such a *striking* nature, that I received sufficient reasons to promise to relearn, what I had forgotten. It was a *sore* lesson, but one which I never forgot."

God placed a strong desire to be a priest upon his heart, but how could he acquire the necessary education required. God called him, and God would provide what was needed. It is related that when Archbishop Purcell was on his way to Piqua to administer the Sacrament of Confirmation, he overtook John (Bishop Luers) walking in the same direction. The Archbishop invited him to mount and ride with the priest accompanying him. The Archbishop soon discovered what was the great desire of the boy's heart and encouraged him with the following words: "Fear not, my son; if God has destined you for the sanctuary and has given you a vocation, He will in His wisdom provide the means. But you must pray, that God's will may be done."

Clearly God did provide as the young John would not only be ordained as a priest but as a bishop and become the first bishop of Fort Wayne-South Bend.

## HERE'S ONE 'SISTER ACT' HARD TO FOLLOW



Ever since she stepped foot into the halls of Piqua Catholic Schools 30 years ago, **S. Mary Alice Haithcoat**, **S.C.**, has gained the respect and admiration of hundreds of students and their parents. Today, the 75-year-old nun is transitioning from a fulltime teaching career to one which still enables her to teach her favorite subject-religion and assist with lunch duty at both the Downing and North Street campuses.

Her decision to reduce her workload was not an easy one, she explains. "You know when the time comes (to retire). I had a teacher's aide who was so vibrant with so many creative ideas. Now was the time to let new people take over."

After discussing her plans with **Principal Brad Zimmerman**, S. Mary Alice agreed to remain and help prepare the forthcoming class of 32 second graders for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion. The preparation itself is "near and dear" to the effervescent nun who first became a Sister of Charity in 1966 and has served as an educator for

over five decades including both Sidney Holy Angels and Greenville St. Mary's schools. In addition to teaching religion, S. Mary Alice will also help prepare students for baptism after school hours.

Anxious to stay involved in students' lives, S. Mary Alice says it "gives me pleasure to watch them grow into adulthood and bring their own children to church. It's been a blessing to see how they raise their children." She proudly admits to seeing three generations of her proteges pass through the ranks.

In looking back, the diminutive nun hopes she has been able to "pass along a love for life and love for God".

When not spending time in her classroom, S. Mary Alice and S. Ginny Scherer, S.C. enjoy weekend walks around Piqua. She's also a "mystery sleuth" and loves to read mystery novels and watch shows on the Hallmark channel. While indulging in mysteries is a passion, listening to the Cincinnati Reds simultaneously on the radio is not uncommon. Travels have taken her to the islands of Haiti and Dominica as well as family outings to Florida.

In summarizing her career, the smiling nun remarked "Education has been part of my life for so long that I cannot imagine not doing it. It's a gift from God."

As a recipient of the school's Hall of Fame, S. Mary Alice has received numerous accolades from her colleagues. Zimmerman noted "Sister is a person that walks the walk and talks the talk. In fact, she is known to many as a 'living saint' because of the way she exemplifies Jesus."

"Her love for our Lord and those she meets is beautiful and contagious. In the classroom, she is just, loving, gives hope, and is a true example of Jesus each and every day."

His comments were echoed by **Heather Ritts Smith**, a co-worker who used such words as "inspirational, supportive, compassionate, caring, patient, generous, trustworthy, understanding, humorous, a friend and unforgettable to describe the senior staff member."

Ritts Smith shared several anecdotes including episodes when S. Mary Alice reclaimed several articles thrown away "because she has a very hard time getting rid of things" or misplacing her keys and the mystery of refinding them.

In her concluding remarks, Ritts Smith indicated Sister Mary Alice has "touched so many lives in her years as an educator. And, I think it goes without saying, you (Sister) have been an important part in my life for many years. I can always count on your support, your prayers, your friendship, and your love."

That's one class act hard to follow!


