Please note that on Sunday, February 27 there will be no 10:15 Mass at Annunciation, no 11:00 am Mass at Corpus Christi and no 2:00 pm Mass at Saint Michael. Mass Intentions

Why request a Mass intention?

Because the Mass is the best prayer we can offer for someone. You can request a Mass intention for someone who is living on their birthday, or when they need special prayers, such as when they are ill, or when they have a special reason to give thanks and celebrate such as a wedding anniversary or a graduation. You can also request a Mass intention for someone who is deceased, because of the Communion of Saints, we believe that our prayers make a real difference for those who have died, it is a wonderful way to remember them and to celebrate the fact that we are still in relationship with them.

The congregation who attends the 10:15 Mass at Annunciation on Sunday, has decided that starting the First Sunday of Lent, March 6, 2022, the time of this Mass will change to 9:45 am to allow the priest more time to visit with parishioners after Mass and get to Saint Michael on time.

Eucharistic Adoration

We need to change our approach to Eucharistic Adoration: (for the safety of the Eucharist and of the people)

Starting in February there will be no Friday Adoration at Annunciation. (There has not been enough people there throughout the day).

We will need to have sign ups to have at least 4 people present at the hour of Adoration offered every week at each of our churches. Please sign up near the doors this weekend.

Tuesday 10:45-11:45 am at Saint Michael Wednesday 6:30 - 7:30 pm at Corpus Christi Saturday 2:30-3:30 pm at Annunciation

Please note that before the shutdown the only Adoration time offered in the parish was on First Friday 9 am - 7 pm at Annunciation, a total of 10 hours a month. In the arrangement listed above this adds up to at least 12 hours a month. In addittion to this we have the Holy Hour every Thursday from 7-8 pm at Corpus Christi an hour of Adoration and guided reflection. For a total of at least 16 hours each month. It means not only an increase in hours but also an increase in terms of having Adoration at all of our churches, in all of our neighborhoods and not only at Annunciation.

The Voice of the Pastor

Synod on Synodality, Participation, Communion and Mission...(Part 2)

As you know, Pope Francis has invited the universal church to enter a 3 year synod process in preparation for the Synod of Bishops on Synodality. The intent of this process is two-fold: 1) to produce a report with input from as many people as posssible to enrich and inform the conversations at the Synod of Bishops as to what concrete measures the universal chuch and the local churches can take to recover a culture of synodality in the church. This is a culture of listening to God and allowing the Holy Spirit to be the one leading the Church. This culture of listening is accomplished when we are able to listen to each other and learn to journey together avoiding any divisions or a sense of conflict between the hierarchy and the people, but a true collaboration in which all from their different gifts and roles participate to build up the church into true communion and set out on mission not following any given agenda but always simply and humbly being

guided by the Spirit.

2) This process, the gatherings and efforts to listen to each other to produce the report and all efforts that can continue to be made into the future are meant to already begin a process of ongoing conversion in our parishes, from a culture of division, ideologies, agendas, etc. to a culture of synodality.

We need to submit our final report at the end of March. They will then put one report together for the whole Diocese and send it to the USCCB, and the USCCB will put one report together for the country and send it to the Vatican.

The Pope has invited us to listen to each other on two fundamental questions:

A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, "journeys together." 1)How is this "journeying together" happening today in your particular Church? 2) What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our "journeying together"?

And to hold conversations around 10 themes. He has also provided us with nine or ten pitfalls to avoid as we have these

Beginning today and for five consecutive Sundays I will introduce each week two of the themes and two of the pitfalls in my bulletin article each week.

We will have dropboxes in the church marked "synod" as well as guides to hold a conversation and forms to submit your input.

I am asking all the different groups and ministries in the parish to meet on Zoom, over the phone, in person, at your own initiative and convenience and have a conversation around the two fundamental questions and as many of the themes as you like, and then to submit your input using one of the provided forms. We are asking that this input remain anonymous so that people can speak freely. As you will see in the form we do ask for some indication of the demographics so that when the report is put together we can indicate age, and relationship to the church of the person or group offering the input.

I also ask all members of the parish to consider holding these conversations with your families, groups of friends, neighbors, adult children, any one you can think of, members of the church or not, Catholic or not, Pope Francis wants to hear from everyone. Even if you just want to call a friend and have a conversation over the phone and then submit your input that would be great. This might also be a great opportunity to call or meet up for coffee with someone who has been away from the church or has been hurt and give them an opportunity to be heard and to then submit their input. We will be gathering input at the parish until March 6.

Once we gather all the input we will put together a report for the parish which we will share in listening sessions after Masses on the weekends of March 13 and 20. This will give all an opportunity to know what has been said and also to add their own input at that conversation if they so desire.

We will then add the report of those listening sessions to all of our other input and submit the parish report to the Diocese by the end of March.

These conversations will allow us to create and submit the report, and most importantly will get us started thinking about the ten themes and learning to sit and listen to each other, hopefully informing our life as a parish for years going forward and slowly prompting us to transform the way we are church to be more prompt to listening to each other and journeying together.

This will not only make us a better church and a better parish, it is essential to our witness in a world that has forgottten how to listen to the other, how to build unity and communion in diversity, how to call forward the participation of all and how to find common ground in the common Mission of humanity to

build a civilization of love.

I think these efforts can help us all relearn skills that are essential not only to our life as church but also to our life as families, coworkers, citizens, etc. We need to stop, and open ourselves once again to listening to each other so that in listening to each other, to all others, those who are different from us, those on the fringes of the church and of society, we can also open ourselves to listening to the Other, God, the Spirit, the only one in whom we can find true guidance, the only one that can build unity in

So I invite all to participate, have a conversation or more with your ministry, your church friends, your family, your friends that do not go to church or go to a different church, people who are away or have been hurt by the church. Lets respond to Pope Francis' call generously. Lets take up the invitation to conversion so that we can once again be a church in communion and not division, so that we can fulfill our **mission** to heal the world.

The Ten Nuclei (Themes): First 2 themes

1) THE **IOURNEYING COMPANIONS**: In the Church and in society, we are side by side on the same road. The Preparatory Document offers the reflection that Jesus is the protagonist of the Church and its people, who proclaims to the crowd; with those called to be apostles and their successors serving in unity and fidelity. The Synodal process ultimately should reveal more fully who Christ is and how he informs the Church (PD,18 - 19). In your local Church, who are the ones "journeying together"? When we say: "our Church," who is part of it? Who is asking us to journey together? Who are the road companions, including those "outside" the Church? What persons or groups are left on the margins, expressly or in fact?

2) **LISTENING:** Listening is the first step, but it requires having an open mind and heart, without prejudices. To whom does our particular Church "need to listen to"? How are the Laity, especially young people and women, listened to? How do we integrate the contribution of Consecrated Men and Women? What space is there for the voice of minorities, the discarded, and the excluded? Do we identify prejudices and stereotypes that hinder our listening? How do we listen to the social and cultural context in which we live?

Avoiding Pitfalls

As on any journey, we need to be aware of possible pitfalls that could hamper our progress during this time of synodality. The following are several pitfalls that must be avoided in order to promote the vitality and fruitfulness of the Synodal Process.

- The temptation of wanting to lead ourselves instead of being led by God. Synodality is not a corporate strategic exercise. Rather it is a spiritual process that is led by the Holy Spirit. We can be tempted to forget that we are pilgrims and servants on the path marked out for us by God. Our humble efforts of organization and coordination are at the service of God who guides us on our way. We are clay in the hands of the divine Potter (Isaiah 64:8).
- The temptation to focus on ourselves and our immediate concerns. The Synodal Process is an opportunity to open up, to look around us, to see things from other points of view, and to move out in missionary outreach to the peripheries. This requires us to think long-term. This also means broadening our perspectives to the dimensions of the entire Church and asking questions, such as: What is God's plan for the Church here and now? How can we implement God's dream for the Church on the local level?
