I invite all to engage in this process, take some time and think back to our Holy Week celebrations: what moved you? What was new and surprising? What stayed with you? What did God invite you to? How did you come to know God’s love more deeply? Or maybe use these 3 simple questions: What was your highest point of this past week? What was the lowest point? What was your God-moment, a moment in which you feel you encountered God personally? An unexamined life is not worth living, and this past week was so filled with grace that we certainly need to take some time to examine it and to gather the gifts given into our heart’s treasure chest.

The Easter Season, a time to deepen our understanding of the Eucharist and grow in our service of this Sacrament

The Bishops of the United States are calling for a three-year grassroots revival of devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. They believe that God wants to see a movement of Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and sent out in mission “for the life of the world.” At our Cabrini Parish we are preparing in a special way for this time of Eucharistic Revival.
