What was your God-moment, a moment in which you feel you encountered God personally? An unexamined life is not worth living, and this past week was so filled with grace that we certainly need to take some time to examine it and to gather the gifts given into our heart's treasure chest.

#### The Easter Season, a time to deepen our understanding of the Eucharist and grow in our service of this Sacrament

The Bishops of the United States are calling for a three-year grassroots revival of devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.
