The Eucharistic Revival for our Diocese will begin at Corpus Christi

It is Cabrini's Parish absolute honor to have one of our churches, the only one in the whole diocese dedicated to this central mystery of our faith: Corpus Christi (The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ) be the site from which this Mission of Love, this outpouring of mercy will begin for our whole Diocese. May this healing river of love begin to flow anew from the heart of our city, from among the poor, as it begun to flow 2,022 years ago, from the humble stable of Bethlehem.

On June 19, 2022, the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, His Excellency Salvatore R. Matano, Bishop of Rochester, will come to our beautiful Corpus Christi Church to celebrate the Diocesan Opening of the Eucharistic Revival with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at 10 am (bilingual) and a Eucharistic Procession and Reception to follow. Representatives from the other 85 parishes in the Diocese will join us for this celebration.

On that weekend all are strongly encouraged to attend Mass with the Bishop at Corpus Christi at 10 am (Bilingual). Only two other Masses will be offered that weekend for those who absolutely cannot make it to Mass with the Bishop:

Saturday, 4 pm at Annunciation in English, and Sunday 11:45 am at Saint Michael in Spanish.

I invite all to place this, the greatest event of the Catholic Church in the United States in this decade on your calendars and to not miss this celebration.

The Voice of the Pastor

Come Holy Spirit!

The events of recent weeks have left us all broken hearted, a little confused and maybe even doubting our faith. I for one have not been able to say anything, because I do not have the words...

Until when will we will have to see our sisters and brothers die because of their skin color, culture, place of origin, gender, etc.? When will we come to understand that we are all children of one Father, that even our concept of race is in itself a mistake for there is only ONE human race, which comes in all colors and shapes.

Until when will we have to see children kill children because we have failed to provide our children with a society in which they can grow to be healthy and happy, where they can grow to be women and men who live for others, artisans of peace who make this world a better place and we have continue to prioritize money over proper measures to prevent gun violence and keep all safe?

Even more, where is God as all this takes place?

As I have prayed over these events 3 things have recurrently come to me:

1. God is where we know God to be through Jesus, always with us, especially with those suffering, holding them, suffering with them.
2. In making us free God surrendered God's power to us and can only intervene in and through us, if we open our hearts to God's constant movements within us asking us to build a civilization of love, to give and to serve. So, we should do all we can. We can pray, which we have done and will continue to do. We can do what is possible to prevent this from happening again, our Justice and Peace Committee (JPC) will make available communication to legislators. We can support our children and youth and again our JPC will roll out a few initiatives this summer to do this.
3. God keeps saying to me: I am tenderly holding them... and I see images of all who were killed in God's loving arms and these words from a poem by Thomas Merton keep coming into my heart: "*God did not make death, God did not make pain but the little blind fire, that leaps from one wound into another knitting the broken bones and fixing sins so that they can be forgotten*"

All we can do in times like this is hold each other through the pain, do our best to keep trusting in God's love for us and do what we can to make the world better.

I said that one of the things we can do is pray, pray above all for LOVE, the only thing that can change all, the one thing that can heal the world. I have shared with you often that when we pray we do not do so because God is holding back and somehow we have to convince a stingy and indifferent God to give us what

we need, no! God is love and gift and always gives us all. When we pray we do so for two reasons: 1. to become aware that God is already giving us what we are asking for, 2. To open ourselves to this gift through our awareness so that the gift can become effective in us. God gives all, but nothing God gives us is given by imposition, no gift is effective until we freely accept it.

So this weekend, in this broken world that needs the healing of love I say: let us pray for love. Let us pray that the love of the Father and the Son will be poured lavishly over this world. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit, which is the love of the Father and the Son will fill us, healing our hearts and bursting through us in effective action to build in this world a civilization of love!

Today, as we celebrate **Pentecost**, the awareness that God has given us God's very self which is LOVE, the **HOLY SPIRIT**, let us pray: come Holy Spirit! May we know the abiding presence of God in us, may we experience God's loving healing touch. May we embrace the **gifts** of the Spirit within us: the **knowledge**(mind) of God as a God fully committed to us, the **understanding** (heart) of how this God is present in our lives as they are, the **wisdom** (hands) to act in collaboration with this abiding presence of God, the **awe** to always know that God is greater and trust that God will have the last word no matter what, the **piety** to desire to serve and please God in all things, seeking to build God's kingdom of love, justice, peace and dignity for all, the **discernment** to know what is right and what we should do, and the **fortitude** to actually do what is right, to do God's Will always so that God's love can reign. May we experience the **fruits** of this Spirit of LOVE, that dwells in us: **love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, chastity.**

And so we pray:

Come, Holy Spirit, come! And from your celestial home Shed a ray of light divine! Come, Father of the poor! Come, source of all our store! Come, within our bosoms shine. You, of comforters the best; You, the soul's most welcome guest; Sweet refreshment here below; In our labor, rest most sweet; Grateful coolness in the heat; Solace in the midst of woe. O most blessed Light divine, Shine within these hearts of yours, And our inmost being fill! Where you are not, we have naught, Nothing good in deed or thought, Nothing free from taint of ill. Heal our wounds, our strength renew; On our dryness pour your dew; Wash the stains of guilt away: Bend the stubborn heart and will; Melt the frozen, warm the chill; Guide the steps that go astray. On the faithful, who adore And confess you, evermore In your sevenfold gift descend; Give them virtue's sure reward; Give them your salvation, Lord; Give them joys that never end. Amen. Alleluia.
