



Today we begin a new liturgical year and a new liturgical season. In this season of Advent we celebrate that in the fullness of time, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, lovingly looked upon the world, and seeing all of our suffering decided to enter the world, to lift us and the whole of creation up from all this suffering.

It was this movement of God's love and mercy that prompted the coming (advent) of Christ into the world. The Holy Spirit came to Mary and once she said "yes," then the Son became incarnate.

Today God looks at each one of us in our brokenness, in our struggles, in our confusion, in our sins, in our despair and with profound love and mercy, says to us: I love you, I am committed to you to the end and I am sending my Son into your life to bring you hope, love, joy and peace. My Son will become human so that eventually you can become divine and enjoy the fullness of life and happiness. My Son will give everything up, so that you can have it all, that is how much we love you.

This season of Advent is a journey of four Sundays, which we mark by lighting candles in our Advent wreath, through which we are invited to humbly and peacefully recognize the darkness in our lives and to foster in our hearts a deep desire to stop finding our own answers and stop seeking in all the wrong places. To find in us that profound longing for Jesus and an openness to truly set everything else aside and welcome the Son into our lives, knowing that only in Him we can find the light to dispel our darkness.

As your household gathers around the Advent Wreath and lights the first candle this week, pray together:

O God, As light comes from this candle, may the blessing of Jesus Christ come to us, warming our hearts and brightening our way. May Christ our Savior bring life into the darkness of this world, and to us as we wait for his coming. Amen.

This first week of Advent we are invited to reflect about *hope*. Hope means that no matter how bad things might be, we continue to believe that things can be better, that a better life and a better world are possible. Hope also means that we believe that God is committed to us, that we are loved and that God is always working to enter our life to make all these good things possible.

This week try not to be overwhelmed by the darkness but instead long for all that is good, and try to recognize the little glimpses of that goodness in yourself, in others, in our world.


