

Happy Easter!

This Sunday we celebrate the most important of all the Christian feasts. The Resurrection is the center of what we believe. We are a people of joy and peace because we believe that God is victorious over death and sin; we believe that love and life will triumph.

Rejoice the Lord is Risen! Easter is not just Easter Sunday, but a whole season that extends for 50 days, until the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The season of Easter is the primary liturgical season of the whole year. In the season of Easter, we are invited to become aware of the ways in which God's mercy has been active in our lives, freeing us and calling us to the peace of knowing that in and through Christ we are

settled. We are God's beloved children. We are God's friends.

The Easter season is an opportunity for us to develop a spirit that defines who we are as Christians. So what does living the spirit of the Easter season mean in practical terms? Here are three concrete suggestions.

Live with Joy

Joy is a deep-down gladness that cannot be taken away, even in the midst of sorrow. The Passion and Resurrection of Jesus teach us that suffering is transformed through faith in the Risen Christ. With this faith, we are able to hold on to an



loved one, a failure to achieve an important goal, or a setback during recovery from an illness.

Live without Fear

The Resurrection teaches us that God can overcome anything, even death. When the Risen Christ appears to the women at the tomb and later to his disciples, his first words are "Do not be afraid!" (Matthew 28:5,10) These words speak to our hearts, helping us cope with the fear from the loss of a job, a serious illness, or a crumbling relationship. Our faith allows us to trust that God can overcome our most serious problems.

Live with New Eyes

no longer at odds with ourselves or with God. All has been Easter means to live with a sense of newness. Just as the return of spring lifts our spirits and makes us feel like the whole world is new, the Resurrection of Jesus makes "all things new." (Revelation 21:5) The Easter spirit is a spirit of renewal that enables us to show up at work with a positive attitude, to renew relationships that have been taken for granted, and to express appreciation and affection to those closest to us. It means to see the world through new eyes-God's eyes.

> Let us use these 50 days to develop an Easter spirit that helps us to be truly Christian: embracing joy, living without fear, and seeing the world again—as if for the first time.
