The Voice of the Pastor

We live in the constant embrace of love of the Most Holy Trinity

Today we celebrate the great Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Between February 26, the First Sunday of Lent and May 18, Ascension Thursday we walked with the Son, from the moment he entered the desert, through his Baptism and ministry unto the Cross, the Resurrection and his return to the Father. Between May 19 and 27 we prepared for the coming of the Holy Spirit, and on May 28 we celebrated the great Solemnity of Pentecost - the coming of the Holy Spirit. Now we will close this intense and graced time of entering into the mystery of God’s love with two beautiful celebrations: The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity and the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity calls us to bring together all we have experienced with the Son and the Spirit and to put it in the context of that community of love that is God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It is also a good time not only to reflect on the love and unity between the three persons of the Trinity, but also to reflect on the Father, as we begin this month dedicated to our earthly fathers. The Solemnity of Corpus Christi, will help us understand how we enter into that life and love of the Trinity, how the whole divine life of the Trinity is shared with us and we are brought into a communion of love with God through our partaking in the Body and Blood of Christ.

Now that we have placed all in context, let’s turn our attention back to the Trinity, its unity of love and especially the person of the Father. This week as we celebrate this mystery I want to invite us all to try and become more and more aware of our existence within the embrace of love of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

The best way to foster this awareness is prayer, and so I want to suggest to you four simple ways in which each day this week you can try to help yourself become aware of that embrace of love: 1) An image to contemplate, 2) a very simple and short prayer exercise, 3) two prayer apps which will guide you to morning prayer and night prayer, each in about 15 minutes, you can decide to do one or the other, both or alternate on different days.

If we exclude from our day little ways in which we use our time, like limiting a little bit of our screen time (social media, TV, playing online games, etc.), we can all carve out 25-40 minutes for prayer each day, and honestly and intentionally place ourselves in the loving presence of God will radically change us and all aspects of our life.

So the **First prayer exercise:** for 1 minute find a quiet moment and place and settle yourself; for 3 minutes very intentionally do the sign of the Cross. As you say “Father” and place your hand on your forehead, bring to your heart and mind all the ways you have experienced the loving care of the Father; as you place your hand on your lower abdomen and say “Son,” reflect on the love of Jesus for you, on His way of serving, giving and forgiving in your life, as you complete the cross by placing your hand first on your left shoulder, and then on your right, think of the strength, inspiration, guidance and love of the Holy Spirit in your life. Now that you have enveloped yourself in the love of the Trinity by tracing the Cross, proof of God’s love for us in such a way that it embraces your whole body, rest for a moment in that all enveloping embrace of love. For 1 minute:

Ask for what you need, give thanks and bring your prayer moment to a close (total time 5 min.)

The **second prayer exercise:** for 1 minute find a quiet moment and place and settle yourself; for 3 minutes contemplate the image below try to experience the love, attention and care of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Feel their embrace. For 1 minute: Ask for what you need, Give thanks and bring your prayer moment to a close (total time 5 min.)



The **third prayer exercise:** I want to suggest since we are invited to highlight the Father this week, we pray with what could be the Father’s response to the “Our Father.” This is my translation of such an exercise José María Rodríguez Olaizola SJ. You can use this one in your prayer or write your own: *My daughter/My son, who are on earth, make it so that your life is the best reflection of my name. Go deeper into my Kingdom with each step you take, each decision you make, every hug or caress or gesture you share or accept. Build the Kingdom with me and for me. That is my Will in heaven and on earth. Take the bread (gift) of each day, aware that it is a privilege and a miracle. I forgive your mistakes, your failures and the times and ways in which you have abandoned me, but please do the same with the frailties of your brothers and sisters. Strive to find the right path in life, knowing that I will always be by your side, do not be afraid; evil will not have the last word in your life. Amen.*

For 1 minute find a quiet moment and place and settle yourself, for 3 minutes very intentionally read this response of God the Father to the “Our Father,” or one you write, and reflect on the love of the Father for you. For 1 minute ask for what you need, Give thanks and bring your prayer moment to a close (total time 5 min.)

The **fourth and final prayer exercise** I want to suggest is using the following apps to guide you in 15 minutes of morning prayer or night prayer (examen) or both: the Apps are called “Pray As you Go” and “Examen (Reimagining the Examen),” they are available for both Android and Ios, and very well put together by Jesuits and their Lay Collaborators.

Father Bob will be on Retreat June 4-8 at Notre Dame in Canandaigua. They have wonderful opportunities at Notre Dame that we should take advantage of. You can learn more about what they offer at: www.notredameretreat.org. Let us all join Fr. Bob in his days of prayer by practicing the 4 exercises suggested this week.
