The Voice of the Pastor

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ and the Gift of Most Holy Communion

Today we celebrate the great Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Between February 26, the First Sunday of Lent, and May 18, Ascension Thursday, we walked with the Son: from the moment he entered the desert, through his Baptism and ministry unto the Cross, the Resurrection, and his return to the Father. Between May 19 and 27, we prepared for the coming of the Holy Spirit, and on May 28 we celebrated the great Solemnity of Pentecost - the coming of the Holy Spirit. Now we will close this intense and graced time of entering into the mystery of God’s love with two beautiful celebrations: The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity and the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity called us to bring together all we have experienced with the Son and the Spirit, and to put it in the context of that community of love that is God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Solemnity of Corpus Christi helps us understand how we enter into the life and love of the Trinity, how the whole divine life of the Trinity is shared with us and we are brought into a communion of love with God through our partaking in the Body and Blood of Christ. Saint Ignatius of Loyola says that a relationship of love is that in which the Lover gives all he is and possesses to the Beloved, and the Beloved does likewise. Every time we partake in Most Holy Communion, God, our Lover, is giving us God’s whole self, all that God is and possesses and longingly asking us to be God’s, to give all we are and possess back to God in love.

This weekend 27 children who have prepared for their First Holy Communion will be receiving the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ for the first time.

I ask that we all keep them in our prayers this week and in the coming weeks, so that their friendship with Jesus will be deepened each day.

I also want to invite all to take some time this week to remember your own First Holy Communion. If you have pictures maybe go looking for them, remember what you experienced that day and how you felt. Remember what Communion has meant to you in times of joy and in times of sorrow and challenge. As you go to Communion try to renew your appreciation of this gift, of Jesus who runs to you, consumed by love, so desiring to be one with you no matter what is happening, Jesus always wants to be your best friend and be always with you.

Please keep the following young people in your prayers and make sure to congratulate them if you see them. Please join us for a short reception celebrating them after Masses this weekend.



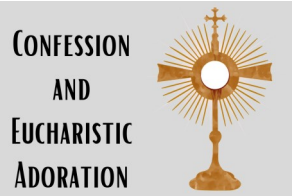
