Mass Intentions and more...

One of the Spiritual Works of Mercy is to pray for the living and the dead. The most excellent prayer we can offer for someone is to associate our prayer for them to the prayer of Jesus the Eternal High Priest in the very offering of Himself to the Father in the Celebration of the Most Holy Eucharist.

At Cabrini Parish we offer you three ways in which you can associate your prayers for someone living or deceased to the prayer of Jesus to the Father in His true presence in the Most Holy Eucharist.

Offering the Bread and Wine, in honor of someone living or deceased for a week. This is a beautiful way of praying for someone that goes to the very core of the Celebration of the Eucharist, in which the work of redemption is accomplished. That is, heaven meets earth, human meets divine, our nature meets God’s grace, the Bread and Wine are transformed into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ and we are conformed to His Image. To offer the Bread and Wine for someone living or deceased is to trust that the same transformation that occurs with the Bread and Wine will be a reality in God’s grace for this person. If they are deceased and in purgatory they will be fully conformed to the image of the Son and transition to the experience of Heaven. If they are living, they will be more closely be conformed to the Son, being lifted up and healed from their wounds and sins, set free and filled with peace and joy.

You can offer the Bread and Wine for a whole week at one of our churches for any one person living or deceased or for more than one person who are closely related: such as saying: My parents, or Adam and Sue Smith. Because we want all to have an opportunity to do this, we limit the number of Bread and Wine intentions one person can request to 5 per year.

Offering the Sanctuary Candle, in honor of someone living or deceased for a week. The candle burns for 7 days, day and night next to the True Presence of Jesus in the Tabernacle bringing your intention close to His Heart unceasingly and in this way associating your prayers to those of the Mass, which are extended in Jesus’ abiding presence in the Tabernacle.

You can offer the Sanctuary Candle for a whole week at one of our churches for any one person living or deceased or for more than one person

who are closely related: such as saying: My parents, or Adam and Sue Smith. Because we want all to have an opportunity to do this, we limit the number of Sanctuary Candle intentions one person can request to 5 per year.

Offering the Mass Intention, in honor of someone living or deceased. This is such a beautiful way to remember that as we gather for Mass, all living and deceased are present, as we are all one in the mystical body of Christ. That we pray together, and that our prayers for one another make a difference.

You can offer the Mass intention for a specific Mass at one of our churches for any one person living or deceased or for more than one person who are closely related: such as saying: My parents, or Adam and Sue Smith. Because we want all to have an opportunity to do this, we limit the number of Mass intentions one person can request to 5 Sunday Masses and 5 weekday Masses per year.

According to the norms of the Church, a Mass can only be offered for one Mass intention. Exceptions to this norm can very scarcely be granted only by the Bishop if there is true need. Understanding the change in our Sunday Mass schedule, our Bishop has granted us permission so that in 2024 we can schedule TWO Mass intentions per Mass for the following TWO Masses each week ONLY: **4 pm Sunday Vigil Mass at Annunciation, and 8:30 am Sunday Mass at Corpus Christi.** So as you schedule your Mass Intentions please know that if you request a Mass intention for one of these Masses, there will always be TWO intentions, yours and someone else's.

Our 2024 Book of Mass Intentions is now open. If you would like to have a Mass intention scheduled for 2024, please do not wait to the last minute when we will not be able to accommodate you, schedule it now. Come into the office or call us during office hours to request your Mass Intentions, Bread and Wine Intentions and Sanctuary Candle Intentions for 2024.

At Cabrini Parish, there is no charge for Mass Intentions, Bread and Wine Intentions or Sanctuary Candle Intentions. If you decide to make a donation, \$10 or more to support the parish we will gratefully accept it.
