The Voice of the Pastor

Cabrini Parish, has the privilege of continuing a long story of the work of the Gospel in the city of Rochester for 156 years. One that begun in 1867 when the parish of the Most Holy Redeemer was established, even before the Diocese of Rochester was created a year later. The story of love, generosity and service of God’s people in the city continued with Saint Michael Church founded in 1873, Saint Francis Xavier SJ Church founded in 1888, Corpus Christi Church founded in 1888, Our Lady of Perpetual Help in 1904, Our Lady of Mount Carmel in 1904, Saint Andrew in 1913, Annunciation in 1914, Our Lady of Sorrows in 1929, and Saint Phillip Neri in 1929. The story of all these churches is the story of human beings who found their strength in God and that moved by their faith were there for one another through the joys and sorrows of life. Sadly, for different reasons many of these churches have closed over the years, yet the memories of times shared, and experienced lived continue to be with us. Through these painful closures many have found a new home in other churches within our parish or beyond our parish and some have not been able to find a home in a new church. This year as we strive for the unity and communion to which the Eucharistic Revival and the Synod on Synodality are calling us we become aware of the diversity contained within Cabrini Parish as the coming together of these 10 churches, all with their distinct cultures, traditions, and memories. We want to honor this diversity, we want to remember those who have come before us and left us this legacy of faith and service, we want to celebrate the richness of each of our churches, those who are still open and those who have closed. We also want to acknowledge the wounds that have been left by all the closures and by the people we have lost along the way, sisters and brothers, which we no longer encounter in our pews and whom we miss. In this year in which we are seeking to become that which we consume in the Most Holy Eucharist, to build that oneness in Christ to which we are called we also want to acknowledge that sometimes, the richness of our diversity, when moved by the pain and resentment of past hurt, can become not

diversity that unifies and enriches, but difference that divides and that prevents us from embracing a new identity and the new gifts that come with our being together as one parish, Cabrini Parish and we want to work to heal the Body of Christ, we want to work to become one as Jesus prayed in His last prayer to the Father: “May they be one as we are one”. Let us come together to remember and celebrate... Let us come together to listen to each other and find healing in those shared stories.... Let us come together to invite back into our family those sisters and brothers that are without a church home... Let us come together to discover the gift of our diversity and set aside our differences to walk in communion towards unity... I want to invite you to attend a special celebration we are having on **Sunday, November 26, 2023 at 10:30 am at Corpus Christi Church 864 E Main Street**. On this day we want to remember, celebrate and acknowledge all who celebrated their faith at the former **Holy Redeemer, Saint Andrew and Saint Francis Xavier, SJ Churches**. On that day we will have **Mass, followed by a meal and time to share our memories as well as the dedication of a space in honor of each community**. Throughout the year we will have other celebrations to acknowledge those who belonged to Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Our Lady of Perpetual Help and Saint Phillip Neri. We already gathered in September to celebrate the patronal feast of Saint Michael and we will do the same for the patronal feasts of Annunciation and Corpus Christi. I ask that if you know of people who used to attend those churches and are no longer celebrating with us, you reach out to them one on one and invite them to join us for this special celebration. I also ask you to extend the invitation to this celebration to all who still celebrate with us to come and remember our communities of origin. May we all come together to celebrate, heal and build the Body of Christ!
