

The Voice of the Pastor

that God is Emmanuel, that Christ is always with us

Given that Advent is a journey of awareness to rediscover God.... that God is Emmanuel, that Christ is always with us here is a very simple way in which you can make sure to remain First Point. The first Point is to give thanks to God our alert with your eyes, mind and heart open to discover the Lord for the benefits received. presence of God in your life, to make straight the way so that you can experience God's comfort and joy.

This simple method will only take 10 minutes each day and is called the Ignatian Examen.

Saint Ignatius of Loyola created several methods of prayer in the 16th century. The first of those methods is **Ignatian Meditation,** which seeks to engage the three "powers" or parts of the human person (as understood in medieval philosophy and theology: memory (our capacity to learn and remember), understanding, (will in prayer). In easier language this type of prayer engages our mind, heart and hands. We can also say that this kind of prayer opens us to three of the gifts of the Holy Spirit: Knowledge, Understanding and Wisdom. The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit make us capable of the fullness of relationship with God. Knowledge, Understanding and Wisdom lead us deeper and deeper Understanding and Wisdom lead us deeper and deeper into proper knowledge of God (These are engaged in Ignatian Meditation). The gifts of piety and awe, lead us to the proper fundamental stance of our whole self before God (Ignatian Contemplation engages these).

Discernment and Fortitude allow us to know and do Discernment and Fortitude allow us to know and do College Will in Self things (The Ignatian Examen engages).

Fourth Point. The fourth, to ask forgiveness of God our Lord for the moments in which you did not realize what God's self things (The Ignatian Examen engages). God's Will in all things (The Ignatian Examen engages these). The Spiritual Life is allowing the life of the Spirit that dwells within us to develop fully in such a way that we can say like Saint Paul that it is no longer us who live but Christ who lives in us. How has God invited you to trust in moments of fear, worry or anxiety?

How has being more aware of God with you helped you be open to doing God's Will in your choices, words and actions today? What has God invited you to? How have
