The Voice of the Pastor



Continuing the work of the Word made flesh

“He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures” (Lk 24:45). The Sunday of the Word of God was instituted by Pope Francis in 2019 and is observed on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time.

“A Sunday given over entirely to the word of God, so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people. Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world.” (Aperuit Illis 2)

We recently concluded the Christmas season in which we celebrated that Jesus, the Word, took flesh and walked among us to bring glad tidings to the poor and freedom to captives. It is our mission as the church, to receive the Word of God, in Holy Scriptures into our beings and allow it to transform us in such a way that the Word can continue to take flesh in this world in and through us. This weekend we celebrate the Sunday of the Word of God, calling us to remember the importance of Holy Scriptures in our lives. This is an invitation to prayer every day with the Scriptures as well as attentive celebration of the banquet of the Word every time we gather for the celebration of Mass. This is also a call to live according to God’s Word, to continue to bring glad tidings to the poor and freedom to, captives. A great way to live out the message of God’s Word at Cabrini Parish is that we can support Matthew’s Closet, Sister Regis Food Cupboard, Saint Vincent de Paul and Rochester Hope with our time, talent and treasure so that the Word can take flesh in the city of Rochester. During this month of January, at Cabrini we have the privilege of welcoming missionaries who taking the Word of God seriously, have offered their lives to reach the poor with the message of the Gospel, and the building of the Kingdom of Justice that the Gospel

demands. By welcoming and supporting them we can be intentional in engaging this work beyond our city. Since I will be away between January 8 and February 2 visiting my family in Colombia and hopefully visiting Homeboy Industries in LA, seeking to continue the process to bring the program to Rochester, this will open the opportunity for us to welcome Missionaries to visit our parish and celebrate the weekend Masses with us, allowing us to connect with the mission of Christ all over the world and support such mission with our prayer and treasure.

This weekend, January 20-21, Fr. Romane St. Vil, from the Maryknoll Missionaries will be visiting us and celebrating all our weekend Masses. Fr. Romane St. Vil has served as a missionary in Cambodia and Tanzania, and will invite us to take part in the vital work of bringing Christ and his gospel to all the people. Maryknoll, a Catholic non-profit mission movement now comprised of four organizations, has been the heart and hands of the U.S. Catholic Church’s overseas mission work for more than 100 years. They are a Catholic Society of Apostolic Life of missionary priests and brothers, sisters, lay missionaries and lay associates; who, for over 100 years, have modeled themselves after the compassion and love of Jesus Christ in reaching out to those in the world who are most in need.

Pope Francis challenges the Catholic Church to create a culture of mission, one in which all Christians respond to their baptismal call to be “Missionary Disciples.” Maryknoll answers this call to mission by sharing the good news of Jesus Christ to those who have not heard it, and by ministering to the hungry, sick, and marginalized in more than 20 countries across the globe. Their work involves direct evangelization and various pastoral ministries, healthcare, education, agricultural and vocational training, HIV/AIDS ministry, disaster relief, and many more in service as heralds of God’s LOVE and HOPE in the poorest areas around the world.


Next weekend, January 27-28, Fr. Runde from Food for the Poor will be visiting us and celebrating all our weekend Masses. In 2023, Food for the Poor’s mission is to link the church of the First World with the church of the Developing World in a manner that helps both the materially poor and the poor in spirit. The materially poor are served by local churches, clergy and lay leaders who have been empowered and supplied with goods by Food For The Poor. The poor in spirit are renewed by their relationship with and service to the poor through our direct ministry of teaching, encouragement and prayer. Ultimately, they seek to bring both benefactors and recipients to a closer union with our Lord. In 2023 they fed 185,400,000, built 1,373 homes, and shipped 2,111 containers of goods and supplies.

May this month be a month of starting 2024 with the right priorities, serving our brothers and sisters, near and far.
