

The Voice of the Pastor

Lent 2024:

Broken we gather, healed we are sent forth

Now that the new year has truly begun and new year resolutions have grown tired, Mother Church wants to remind us of who we are and what we are capable of. We were created out of love for the fullness of life and, aided by God's grace expressed in and through the community, we can grow into the fullness of who we are. We can be more and more alive, more and more free, more and more healed day by day! Life is a journey of continued healing and ever-growing life until the day we find ourselves in God's loving arms forever.

The sacred season of Lent will begin soon with the celebration of Ash Wednesday, on Wednesday, February 14th. Lent will extend for forty days until we begin the Sacred Triduum with the celebration of the Institution of the Most Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday.

These two symbols will guide our journey: Ashes and Eucharist. The ashes which we will receive on Ash Wednesday remind us of our humble origins, we were created out of dirt, and in this way help us to acknowledge that we are yet unfinished, that there are aspects of our life that are still in need of healing and growth. Yet we acknowledge this reality in peace, without guilt or shame, and more than anything without a sense of failure or despair. The God who began our creation out of nothing, continues to work to create us into the fullness of being and can bring the fulness of life out of the ashes we might feel we are. Lent, first and foremost is a reminder that God has not given up on us, that God is intent on making us whole, and has the power to do so.

So on Ash Wednesday we will offer many opportunities for you to receive the Ashes and begin this journey of humbly acknowledging your brokenness and bringing it into the healing space of God's love and the community, so that together we can journey towards healing, wholeness, and life.

Here are the many ways in which you will be able to receive ashes at Cabrini Parish on Wednesday, February 14, 2024:

Come for an individual Rite and Imposition of 8. Ashes

- 1:00pm-3:00pm outside Saint Michael Church

Since we are in the three years of the Eucharistic May this Lenten season be one of healing and Revival, the main image that will guide our Lenten Journey will be the Eucharist.

The Eucharist reminds us of God's desire to share God's very self and life to the fullest with us; of God's power to transform us, in the same way that plain bread and wine are transformed into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, we too, in all of our brokenness, are healed and transformed into the likeness

The Eucharist reminds us that we are created for perfect union/oneness with God, and with one another, and that our healing and growth is not an individual endeavor that happens based on new year resolutions, but a process of love lead by the God who creates, redeems, and sanctifies us. This healing only happens in the context of such love, in relationship with God and others as a shared journey, a collaboration.

The Eucharist also reminds us that the purpose of our healing is not simple self-growth, it is not about us, but about bringing about the community that God desires, that unity for which Jesus prayed in his last prayer to the Father: may they be one as we are one.

Our healing begins with the Eucharist (source of our union with God and others in the one Body of Christ), and ends (finds it summit) in the same Eucharist, healing our divisions so that we can be that community of unity in diversity that allows us to be fully alive, and brings true glory to God. That is why our Lenten journey this year is summed in the motto: Broken we gather, healed we are sent forth.

Throughout the season we will have an at home ritual to assist us in the journey. We invite you to avoid coming with all kinds of resolutions for this season and instead simply follow the process and opportunities we will

- 1. Receive ashes on Ash Wednesday
- Make it a point to attend Mass every Sunday and if possible for you at least one additional time during
- Celebrate the Sacrament of Confession, more info on opportunities for this next week.
- Follow our at home ritual
- Attend Eucharistic Adoration as possible, more info on opportunities for this next week.
- 6. Save the date and attend our Lenten Retreat with Father Jack Podsiadlo, SJ, on February 24, 2024, at Corpus Christi beginning at 10:00 am.
- 7. Practice fasting and abstinence ONLY as prescribed by the church, without adding anything. More info on this next week.
- Save the date and plan of attending all the liturgies of our Sacred Triduum, if possible take time off work and/or do all you can to make these three days into a mini retreat focused on God's saving love in your life, leading you from brokenness to healing, from death into life.


