



The Voice of the Pastor

Broken We Gather, Healed We are Sent Forth

Lent is a time to allow ourselves to become aware of God's desire and power to heal us, to make us whole, and for us to engage and collaborate with that process.

To help us do that, today we are providing you with a broken plate and a marker. In a few weeks we'll be providing you with glue. We will all be doing this ritual together throughout the next 5 weeks as we prepare to celebrate Easter. If you cannot get to church or were unable to get a plate you can just use one you have at home.

I will share the first three weeks of our ritual this week and the remaining two weeks in the article next week to hopefully engage us all in this reflection and openness to God's healing.

These first three weeks are about peacefully identifying what is broken and hurting and then placing it before the Lord to be able to see it with the Lord's compassion and insight as to how to best approach collaborating in our healing. One cannot be treated effectively without a diagnosis, so this part of the process is very important.

Week one: February 14-23: You have received a broken plate. This week what we will be doing is naming each of the pieces of your broken plate. Using the marker we invite you to label the back of each piece.

Take a few minutes each day this week to sit quietly and prayerfully place before you the bag with the pieces. As you contemplate the pieces. As you contemplate the broken plate ask yourself, in God's presence, "What are the biggest wounds, obstacles or hurtful behaviors that are getting in the way of my wholeness? What takes away my peace, joy, hope, love, and faith?"

Make a list of as many items as there are pieces to your plate. Do this three days in a row, the list might change on different days. On the fourth day, look at your three lists and settle on one list of items that best reflects your brokenness. Write those items on the back of the pieces of the plate with your marker.

For the next days take one piece each day and talk to Jesus about it. Try to better understand the nature of this wound, obstacle, or behavior and to extend yourself the compassion that you see Jesus extending you.

Each day, hand over your brokenness to God, ending these few minutes of prayer with the following or similar

Compassionate Jesus, you look lovingly upon my brokenness and see my goodness. You understand why I have made the mistakes I have made and suffer with the ways life and others have hurt me. All you want is to bring about forgiveness, healing and blessing in my life touching my brokenness with

your love. I hand over all this brokenness today, trusting that you receive it in love and that you can heal me. Amen.


Week two: February 24-March 1: Take a few minutes each day this week to prayerfully reflect on the following questions: How does my relationship with myself play into my brokenness? What is Jesus inviting me to do to allow healing? These questions might help guide your 3 minutes of loving conversation each day this week:

- •What do I need to forgive myself for? Am I able to extend compassion to my younger self and understand the circumstances that surrounded those choices?
- •What are parts of my story that might not have turned out as I hoped for? Can I ask Jesus to help me find peace with my story as a whole?
- •What are parts of me that I struggle to value, in my mind, in my body, in how I process emotions and feelings? Can I ask Jesus to help me find peace with my being as a whole?
- •What are ways of thinking of, and speaking to and

g somos termimos, sanados somos carrillados. about myself that harm me? Can I gently replace this by acknowledging goodness in myself, hearing Jesus say: "I love you and I am proud of you"?

•What are behaviors that hurt me or others that I struggle with? What might be at the root of these behaviors? What can I do to change them with Jesus' help?

Estation of the praying the pr Week three: March 2-8: Take a few minutes each day this week to prayerfully reflect on the following questions: How are my relationships with others playing into my brokenness? What is Jesus inviting me to do



- •Are there specific conflicts in my relationships that Jesus is inviting me to resolve?
- •Are there relationships that are harmful to me that Jesus is inviting me to find the courage to leave?
- •Are there behaviors that might be hurting my relationships that I can work on?
- •What do I feel might be lacking in my relationships? Might this reflect ways in which I am failing myself, and not necessarily ways in which others are failing me? Can I not place blame and instead show up for myself?
- •All relationships have limitations, can I celebrate what is possible and hope that the Lord will supply for the rest in this world, and for fully developed relationships in the next, instead of focusing on everything that is missing in every relationship?
- •Can I be intentional about building and nourishing relationships? We are not meant to be alone.
