Set time aside...

We all have busy lives and can always benefit from stopping and there is no best time and way to do so, than to set aside as much time as possible during Holy Week to enter this time of rest, prayer and living the experience of God’s love for us. Give yourself the opportunity to rediscover the beauty of your faith by attending our Holy Week celebrations.

Prepare for...

We will have two special opportunities to help us best prepare for the celebration of the Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday/Easter Sunday). On Friday, March 22 we will offer 8.5 hours of confessions so that you can celebrate healing and set aside any guilt or shame that has been burdening so that the holy days can truly be a celebration of peace.

On March 26 , the Bishop will gather with all the priests in the Diocese for the Chrism Mass where the priests renew their promises and the Sacred Oils are blessed and consecrated for the celebration of the Sacraments throughout the year. All are invited to attend this beautiful Mass to be reminded of how Jesus continues to enter our lives to heal us, bless us and lift us up through His ministers and his Sacraments.

Chrism Mass

Join our Bishop and the Priests in the Diocese for the Chrism Mass on March 26, 7:00pm at Sacred Heart Cathedral. During this Mass the Bishop will bless the Holy Oils that will be used in the coming year. The Chrism Mass is also a key moment in which the unity of the Bishop with his priests is manifested and renewed.

Live the experience...

Palm Sunday (March 23-24)

We commemorate the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem. We celebrate together Saturday at 4:00 pm at Annunciation in English, Sunday at 8:30 am at Corpus Christi in English, 10:00 am at Corpus Christi in Spanish, 11:45 am at Saint Michael in Spanish.

Holy Thursday (March 28)

On Holy Thursday Morning we receive the new oils into our churches and gather with those who due to illness,

age or other reasons are unable to gather for the longer celebrations of this week and with all others who want to come for a short service with the Anointing of the Sick.

A **service with Anointing of the Sick** will take place at Annunciation at 10:00 am in English

A **service with Anointing of the Sick** will take place at Saint Michael at 12:10 pm in Spanish.

We celebrate together at 7:00 pm at Corpus Christi. This evening we enter the Sacred Triduum. The celebration of the **Bilingual Mass of the Lord’s Supper** commemorates the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood, as well as Jesus’ command of love and service.

Highlights of the Evening Mass of the Lord’s Supper:

- The liturgical color for this celebration is white.
- We sing the Gloria while bells ring (bring bells from home).
- Washing of the Feet
- The Stripping of the Altar and Sanctuary
- The Reservation of the Most Holy Eucharist
- Adoration: We invite you to join us for Adoration at each of our 3 churches from 9 pm until 11 pm. We invite you throughout this night to piously contemplate how Jesus was in prison and to spend some time with Him in prayer, truly present in the Most Holy Eucharist.

Experiencing this liturgy: On Holy Thursday we celebrate the Mandatum, the one commandment that Jesus gives us, to love one another as He has loved us. This Christian love is expressed mainly as service, which is usually symbolized during this liturgy by the washing of the feet. We invite all to take this opportunity to experience this profound symbol of Christian love.

Good Friday (March 29)

We invite all to join us for a **Bilingual Ecumenical Walk for Peace with the Stations of the Cross**. We will gather in the parking lot at Corpus Christi Church (864 E Main St) at 11:45 am and soon depart on our walk towards Saint Michael, making fourteen stops along the way for reflection and prayer for peace with the Stations of the Cross. The Way of the Cross will be made present along the way as members of our community will be dressed up and playing the different characters of the Passion of Our Lord. When we arrive at Saint Michael’s, around 2:45 pm all will be invited in to rejoice in the beauty of the church. Cars can be left at Corpus Christi, transportation will be available for those unable to walk the distance, vans will join us on the walk and stop at each of the stations with us. The vans will bring all in

attendance back to Corpus Christi from Saint Michael at the end of the walk.

Stations of the Cross will be prayed in English at Annunciation at 8 am.

At 3:00 pm at Saint Michael we will have the **Bilingual Solemn Commemoration of the Lord’s Passion and Death**. Jesus really died on the cross. We gather together today to prayerfully recall Jesus’ death “in the sure hope of the resurrection” (Prayer Over the People, Good Friday). Because His Resurrection is inseparable from His death, the Lord’s Passion is truly celebrated. We should glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, for He is our salvation, our life, and our resurrection, through Him we are saved and made free.

Highlights of the Liturgy:

- The color of this celebration is red.
- We begin in silence.
- Liturgy of the Word includes the proclamation of the Passion of the Lord according to the Gospel of John.
- The Solemn Intercessions.
- The Adoration of the Holy Cross - The faithful are invited to come forward and make a sign of reverence in front of the Cross.
- Holy Communion
- We depart in silence (It would be good if we can try to make this a day of silence at home, or at least spend a reasonable amount of time in silence after the Liturgy).

Experiencing this liturgy: As we contemplate the Crucifix, we know that God cares about our suffering and understands our pain. We are not alone, God listens to our cries, and our prayers. On this day the Church does solemn prayers for many intentions before the crucified Lord. We invite you to write down your own intentions that you want to pray for at this beautiful liturgy. You can deposit those written intentions at the foot at the Cross in church when you approach it to adore it.

Holy Saturday (March 30)

The Rosary of the Seven Sorrows of Mary, will be prayed in English at Annunciation at 8 am and in Spanish at 9 am at Corpus Christi.

We celebrate together at 7:30 pm at Annunciation with the **Bilingual Great Easter Vigil of the Resurrection of Our Lord**.

Highlights of the Liturgy: Finally, the Resurrection of the Lord is celebrated as the high point of the liturgical year and the pattern for Sunday Mass throughout the year. The Renewal of our Baptismal Promises on Easter reminds us that in dying with Christ through Baptism, so also do we share in His Resurrection.

- The color of this celebration is white.
- The Solemn Beginning of the Vigil
 - The Blessing of the Fire and Preparation of the Candle
 - The Easter Proclamation (Exsultet)
- The Liturgy of the Word
 - Listen to the stories of God’s plan of salvation.
 - We sing the Gloria while bells ring (bring bells from home).
 - We sing the Alleluia for the first time since Lent began.
- Baptismal Liturgy: Renewal of Baptismal Promises. Celebration of Baptisms and Confirmations.
- The Liturgy of the Eucharist

Experiencing this liturgy: On this the greatest night of all, we celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord, which is symbolized by the new fire from which we light the Easter Candle. Every time we light this candle in church during the year it reminds us of the promise of eternal life, of the certainty of God’s victory, of our hope. If you want you can prepare your own white jar candle (they are only \$1 at a dollar store), that you can then use during the liturgy when we light the Easter Candle, this way throughout the year you will have at home a candle blessed on this the holiest of nights and lit during the Easter Vigil, that you can light to be reminded of God’s victory and the promise of Resurrection. You can find instructions to prepare the candle at: www.cabriniroc.org/holyweek. This liturgy extends into our Sunday liturgies celebrating Easter.
