GOPSEL REFLECTION



This Sunday there is a collection for the Evangelization of the Nations/World Mission Sunday. This is the Holy Father's annual appeal for spiritual and financial support so that the life-giving work of overseas mission and missionaries can continue.

This year's theme 'We Cannot Remain Silent – We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard (Acts 4:20)' is twofold. It is a message of hope – Jesus Christ is risen, and we cannot keep his love, compassion, and mercy to ourselves. It also challenges us to stand up and speak out on behalf of those who are weaker. All too often, the voices that need to be heard are not the loudest. For them, we cannot remain silent.

The mission is closely linked to the love of Christ which springs from gratitude. The Covid-19 Pandemic has made many people fragile, marginalized, and vulnerable. But the presence and compassion of Christ bring to our fragile world consolation and hope.
