

### POPE'S MESSAGE FOR WORLD DAY OF YOUTH (WYD)

In his message, the pope praised young people for their resilience throughout the coronavirus pandemic, which has claimed more than 4.7 million lives worldwide. "All over the world, we saw great numbers of individuals, including many young people, helping to save lives, sowing seeds of hope, upholding freedom and justice, and acting as peacemakers and bridge builders," he wrote. "Arise! Uphold social justice, truth, and integrity, human rights. Protect the persecuted, the poor and the vulnerable, those who have no voice in society, immigrants." He continued: "Arise! Testify to the new way of looking at things that enables you to view creation with eyes brimming with wonder, that makes you see the Earth as our common home and gives you the courage to promote an integral ecology." This year's theme is "Arise! I make you a witness of what you have seen," inspired by Jesus' words to St. Paul recorded in [Acts 26:16](#).

## GOSPEL REFLECTION



Nearly two years of a pandemic has left us all weary in the experience of division, confusion and isolation. It has been a deep form of suffering for many people, but the heart of the Gospel message is that our suffering can be transformed and redeemed. In these times of insecurity and uncertainty, we are called to deepen and enliven our hope in Jesus. The reading from Mark and Daniel points us to the end times, in which Scripture is clear on two things: the end will come, and we will not know the date or hour. But we are called as Christians to be ever watchful and to yearn for His coming. The antidote to the fear and anxiety is the invitation of the Psalms to find our refuge in God. Every moment of our lives is held in God's heart. Our God is with and within us, behind and before us. There is nothing that can remove us from His care.
