

## **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

Many Christians fear death and try to keep the very thought of it far from their minds. This is very understandable for one who believes that death is the end. To a certain degree it is understandable in the case of the believer or the Christian, whose conscience is not at peace with God. That latter, however, has the means of removing his fears by removing his sins, and by putting himself right with God. The normal, pious Christian should see death as what it is, an end of his time of probation and the door to his eternal reward. It is not normal for a student to dread his graduation day. Death for the God-fearing, honest Christian is graduation day. Therefore, no Christian should be afraid of it.

Of course, part of the fear which death instils comes from the fear of the judgment that accompanies it. If we think every now and then, that our death is around the corner, we will turn to the God of mercy, to our loving Father, and ask for His forgiveness. He never refuses pardon to those with a sincere heart. Let each one of us look into our own conscience this morning. Let us ask ourselves, how we would fare if death should claim us tonight. If there are sins on my conscience, which I would not want there when facing my just Judge, I still have time to approach the merciful Father. The Christian who does this daily, or even weekly, will not worry when death calls. He can rest assured that it is the beginning of the true and everlasting life, planned for him by God before time began. *Excerpted from The Sunday Readings, Fr. O' Sullivan, O.F.M.*

## NEW REPORTING STRUCTURE AT THE PARISH

With the pastoral year well underway, I want to share with you a new process that is being implemented here at St. Patrick Parish. I am calling it the New Reporting Structure at the Parish. Up to this point, it is the common practice for individual parishioners or parish groups to ask me for what is needed in that particular instance. For example, (and this is a true story) a parishioner once approached me five minutes before Mass was to begin asking that I replace the toilet paper in the washroom as the roll was now empty. While this request was urgent and important, it isn't really something that I would need to attend to just prior to Mass beginning. I imagine the individual making the request might have thought that I would delegate this task to an usher. However, the request, as are many requests, was made to me with the expectation that action would be taken.

The New Reporting Structure at the Parish invites parishioners and groups who would make a request of the parish to address their requests to the council, ministry, committee, or group leadership directly. For example, a request to take up a collection at Christmas would be addressed to the Chair of the Pastoral Council; a request to have repair work done in the church or hall would be addressed to the Chair of the Finance Council. A request that affects a liturgical ministry would be addressed to the head of that ministry (Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, etc.) or to the Chair of the Liturgy Committee.

The principal reason for this change is that most of the requests made to me could be answered and acted upon by those in leadership positions within the parish. Each of our leaders is empowered to carry out the work of their council, ministry, committee, or group. This new process will allow for direct and collaborative interaction between parish leaders and parishioners which will continue to build-up the parish and the People of God of this faith community. A list of the ministries and groups has been posted on the bulletin boards. It also contains the name and the contact information for a representative of each group. You may also call the parish office for this information.
