Weekly Meditation

You will be my witnesses. (Acts I:8)

Today's first reading describes the last time the apostles saw the risen Christ. Luke describes the scene in the very first chapter of his Book of Acts, but words alone can't capture the amazement and wonder the apostles must have felt when they saw Jesus "lifted up" into heaven (Acts 1:9). They were blessed indeed to have seen all that Jesus said and did, from the beginning of his ministry up to this dramatic moment.

But along with this privilege came a great responsibility. In his final instructions to his apostles, Jesus said, "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts I:8). This was their new purpose in life, the very reason why Jesus had chosen them in the first place. Upon their eyewitness accounts would rest the faith of millions of believers—and the entire Church through the centuries.

Of course, many other people have followed in the apostles' footsteps by witnessing to Christ. They may not have seen Jesus firsthand, but they have experienced his presence and the power of his Holy Spirit in their lives. In fact, every person who calls himself a believer is also, by default, a witness to Christ.

Do you think of yourself as a witness? If you follow Jesus, you can't help being one. You witness by the values that guide you, by the love you show others, and by your life of prayer. You witness when you share how God is working in your life or how he has forgiven you or answered a prayer.

Jesus' final words at his Ascension weren't just for his apostles; they are for you, too. So how might you witness to Jesus today? Every day presents a new opportunity—one that might just lead another person to a new or deeper love of the Lord.

Sister Parish Connection

Victor and 3 parishioners. Since then, five additional teams have traveled to Pacuan and a team from St. Vincent traveled to Annandale in 2013. The vision/mission is to share, experience, and grow in our Catholic faith with one another. For the next few weeks, we would like to share experiences of those who have traveled.

Breanna Chapman, 2014

"I went to Pacuan after graduating my senior year of high school. At 5' 4" it was so odd being a head and shoulders higher than most of the people there. I recorded 7 people on a two-seater motorcycle, plus bags. We did a living rosary with the people of Pacuan, a memory which I can still see clearly nearly 10 years out, a circle of people from across oceans standing together, candles flickering against the dark night on the mountain. It meant so much to pray with the people of Pacuan and know that prayer is the same everywhere. We also had so much fun and laughter-we taught the teens duck, duck, goose....but neglected to mention you had to run around the circle and, as a result, our first demonstration ended with us trying to catch someone who ran straight away and out of the yard. We attended a 6:30 a.m. wedding ceremony at church--can you imagine anyone in the USA getting married at 6:30 in the morning? Their wedding was so beautiful, and I loved the tradition of going to confession five minutes before saying I do, so that you come into the marriage whole in spirit. To those who are thinking about it-GO. It's a life changing experience. It's a faith deepening experience. It's eye opening and inspiring. If you are waiting for a sign---here it is. Take the leap of faith and let the worldwide church catch you in its beauty and majesty."

Gospel Meditation

Traditionally, the four writers of the Gospels are symbolized by four creatures that make their way into Church art and architecture: Matthew, an angel; Mark, a lion; Luke, an ox; and John, an eagle. These images can be found in churches across the world, a nod to those who recorded the stories of Jesus for us, thousands of years ago.

Today's Gospel was written by John. There are a few reasons why John is symbolized by an eagle, but my favorite explanation is that his writings soar like an eagle into the sky with their beautiful, poetic language. The prayer we hear today is no different — Jesus invokes God in a long discourse that might seem mystifying at times, the same way that a poem can be perplexing to understand when we are unfamiliar with the pacing or format.

Consider holding onto the shortest sentence in this prayer: "I pray for them."

Jesus prays for us. For me. For you.

Let that sink deep into your being.

Jesus is on your side. He is aware of what you are holding at this moment. He is aware of your pain, your faith, your mission. And He's rooting for you. This prayer was recorded thousands of years ago, far before you were born. Since before you were born, you were held in prayer. With that certainty, we live.
