# Weekly Meditation

### ... from every nation under heaven. (Acts 2:5)

Today's first reading makes it pretty clear: the Holy Spirit wants *everyone* to hear the good news and come together through faith in Jesus. Men and women from all over the known world were in Jerusalem for the feast of Pentecost, and they didn't all speak the same language. But when the Spirit came upon the believers gathered in the upper room, that massive crowd heard the disciples proclaiming God's mighty works in their own languages, and that manifestation of God's power helped them come to believe!

That miracle of God gathering people from all over the world wasn't limited to the first Pentecost. Consider Philip preaching to the Ethiopian court official (Acts 8:26-40) or Peter preaching to the Roman centurion Cornelius (10:34-48) or Paul preaching to the philosophers of Athens (17:22-34). The Spirit came in power both upon those who preached and those who heard. He broke down barriers and brought people together through the gospel.

The Holy Spirit still wants to dismantle walls between people from all walks of life and bring them together. And by virtue of your baptism, you are called to participate in that mission.

How? You can start right where you live. You're sure to encounter someone who might not "speak your language." Maybe someone in your family or among your neighbors has a different worldview than you do. Maybe there are people who come from a different country or from a different generation. Bring Jesus to them. Just say a prayer, open your mouth, and trust the Spirit to work through you to bring them together.

The Holy Spirit is still eager to bring us all together in Christ. Let him fill you on this special day!

#### Gospel Meditation

I hope you'll acknowledge with me a simple fact: it's not normal to have tongues of fire "part and come to rest" on people. It is actually pretty strange. Yet that is precisely what we celebrate in this feast of Pentecost. How can this mean something to us in our daily lives?

Jews had a tradition that heaven is a temple made of bricks of fire. So, through the apostles, the heavenly temple is coming to earth. But this fire looks like tongues, not bricks. That means that heavenly speech will be crucial to building a dwelling place for God on earth among men and women. So, it's no surprise when the apostles begin to speak in a miraculous way that is understood by all language groups. They are speaking of what God has done in and through Jesus: bringing heaven to earth and uniting all peoples to God and to each other.

How often our speech divides: gossip, slander, insults, and so on. How strange and rare it is when people speak in ways that truly unite instead of divide. Imagine how powerful it would be if you and I began to speak at home, at work, and in our community in a way that made people hear heavenly speech. Imagine if you spoke of the mighty deeds of God in a way that everyone could understand. That's precisely what the Holy Spirit descends upon us to do. Ask Him to come as a tongue of fire to you once again, and He will. Then speak!

Pentecost is the celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit on Jesus's Apostles after His Ascension into Heaven. It is the birthright of the Church. Pentecost is associated with Gifts of the Holy Spirit received at Baptism and fortified at Confirmation.

#### The Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit

**I. Wisdom** – the greatest of all the gifts. To relish the things of God. The desire to pray, go to Mass, etc.

**2. Knowledge** – having the mystical eyes to see God present in nature and circumstances of our life. Helps to see the world from God's perspective.

**3. Understanding** - explains the Word of God and doctrines of faith (Catechism).

**4.** Counsel – encourages us to follow the solution that most matches the glory of God and the good of others. Right, reason, and action.

**5. Fortitude** – helps us to overcome difficulties with faith. Gives us strength to do our duties well and perfects the virtue of patience.

**6.** Piety – moves us to treat God with the trust with which a child treats his Father. Helps to recognize God is our loving Father. All of us are brothers and sisters.

**7. Fear of the Lord** – compels us to flee from sin and always choose to please God. Inspires us with a desire not to hurt God and to trust in God.

Wisdom, Knowledge and Understanding perfects our Intellect. Counsel is a bridge between Intellect and the Will. Fortitude, Piety, and Fear of the Lord perfects the Will.

> <u>Prayer to the Holy Spirit</u> Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful. And kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And you will renew the face of the earth.
