 sheets for helping with the various parts of the event. Nicole has tickets for the

Jessica mentioned that someone asked why it wasn't held after a mass. There hasn't ever been something actively going on during mass. This is also a good opportunity to welcome people who aren't parishioners. There was a wide variety of items that were not necessarily holiday

décor so it might be good to have craft items there as well. The people who decorate the church also got items to decorate the church with. We are looking to host this again around the same time next year before faith formation starts so the basement is available. It might be fun to have cookies, coffee, and music during the sale next year.
