Dear Fellow Parishioners of and Visitors to St. Pius X,

While it seems much longer ago, the first meeting of the newly organized St. Pius X Parish Pastoral Council was held on March 9th of this year. Currently in a formation phase, we are a council small in number. Each of us was tapped by Fr. Kevin to bring dedication, time and talent against the objectives: to build the parish ministry structure; to be the ears of the parish; to develop immediate plans through long-term strategy, and to be a sounding board for and advisor to Fr. Kevin.

In a period of three months much has been accomplished, and there is much more to do. Based on the survey responses of the parishioners and the guidance of the Archdiocese, we will target three strategies over the summer months: Youth Programs; Welcome and Hospitality Ministry, and Church and Grounds Infrastructure. This is not to say that other ministries will not be active. The Parish Pastoral Council Schematic below includes active ministries and committees – newly-established and continuing – that have Ministry or Committee Heads identified. Bylaws, charters, procedures, calendars, and volunteer needs are being developed.

I look forward to providing updates quarterly as to the progress of the Parish Pastoral Council and as milestones are reached. In the meantime, and on behalf of the parish, I want to thank all those who have volunteered for Ministries and Committees. I personally would like to thank the members of the Council who have committed time, thought and energy to this parish effort as well as to the Parish Staff that supports us all.



For we must all appear before the judgement seat of Christ, so that each one may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or bad."

The words of St. Paul to the Corinthians are truly welcome. We have been reminded constantly during the past fifteen months of the virus and death. The pandemic should teach us to think of that day which awaits us all. We do so, not out of fear, but aware that we are going home to our home.
