#### **EUCHARISTIC ADORATION**

#### WHY CATHOLICS NEED EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

Since Christ is truly present in the Eucharist in His sacred humanity hypostatically united with the divine nature, the Eucharist should receive the adoration of latria that is given exclusively to God. Adoration of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament is a natural consequence of the Church's faith in the real substantial presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

Adoration corresponds most directly to the first of the three principal purposes for which Christ instituted the Eucharist, which is that Christ wished to perpetuate His adorable human presence among us after ascending definitively into heaven. The Eucharist is the solution to this problem. The divinity of Christ is omnipresent, but, after His Ascension, His humanity is substantially present only in heaven and in the Eucharist. Since the Son of God became man for us and has devised a marvelous way to remain with us in the Eucharist in the substantial presence of His humanity, it follows that adoration of and intimate encounter with Christ in the Blessed Sacrament is not an afterthought, but rather an essential aspect of the Eucharist.

St. Pius X invites you to join us for the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on the first Tuesday each month after the 9:00 a.m. Mass. Our upcoming Adoration is on Tuesday, July 6th, from 9:30–10:30 a.m.

## A Message from Father Kevin

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Last weekend was my only weekend away since arriving at St. Pius X. While my vacation was a blessing, I also missed you very much. In such a short period of time, this parish has become my home, not only physically, but also in mind and heart. I often find myself repeating the words of the Psalmist, "O, how can I give thanks to the Lord for his goodness to me?" (Psalm 116)

One way I can thank the Lord is to make every effort to transform this parish into a welcoming community that worships God and makes disciples. As you know, this is a team effort. Even Jesus didn't minister alone. So, I thought I'd use my column this week to offer a brief overview of where we're headed as we lean into the summer.

Much work has been done in developing our new pastoral council. Two weeks ago, Rosemarie Loffredo, the Chair of the Pastoral Council, wrote a letter in the bulletin describing a bit of who we are and what we're doing. I'd like to expand on that a little bit.

Four initiatives that are of particular importance to me in the immediate future are: (1) planning for the start of our middle and high school youth groups in the fall; (2) developing a family-centered Mass; (3) revamping the finance council to increase clarity, strategy, and participation; and (4) expanding our hospitality ministry.

Currently, five parishioners and I are doing the detailed planning for the start of youth group in September. (*High school*: Christine Massaro, Mike LaViola, Mariliza LaCap-Tong. *Middle school*: Alicia Soltys and Geraldine Tama). If you'd like to jump on board and volunteer, please reach out to any one of us. Several parishioners have done so already. But the more the merrier. Teamwork makes the dream work!

The pastoral council and I have also been looking into ways to offer a family-centered Mass. While there are several elements of the liturgy, we can adapt to become more child friendly (the readings, music, preaching, and so on), we are also looking into how we can better utilize our daily Mass chapel. One idea is to transform it into a family chapel so that young families can have the extra space they may need during Mass. It can also serve as a welcome space when there's overflow, especially during Christmas and Easter.

Over the last 20 years, the finance council has done incredible work in managing a tight budget, as well as working on paying down our pre-existing debt. I want to thank Mark Fable and all who have served so generously. Now that we're entering into a new era, Mark and I will be re-considering the roles and responsibilities that parishioners can have in shaping our financial future. If you are interested in possibly joining the finance council, please contact either Mark or me.

I'd also like to thank Kathy Sheridan for developing our hospitality ministry. We are constantly greeting newly registered parishioners. Kathy and her team are working to make sure all are welcomed. #### A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time ~ June 27, 2021

"One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, 'My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live.' He went off with him... He took her by the hand and said to her, 'Talitha koum', which means 'little girl, I say to you arise."

How frequently people ask for prayer for someone who is ill. During the pandemic we have become increasingly aware of the power of intercessory prayer for healing. The sure gift we can give another is to offer prayer.

The official knelt and pleaded with his whole heart as any good parent would. He asked for the beautiful gesture of laying on of hands. When we celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the same gesture is used as we implore the presence of the healing God for the sick person.

Who is it that needs my prayer today? A family member who is ill, someone who has wandered from the faith, a person asking for guidance as to what to do – school, work, vocation? Like the official, don't just pray, but earnestly plead. The Lord will always listen. He takes us by the hand too.
