### A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Where do I begin? So many good things have started unfolding in our parish, my heart overflows with joy! The excitement is almost palpable; you can sense it in the air; you can see it on people's faces. As someone said to me recently, "People are just happy."

"Why?" you might wonder. Happy because we're bringing new life and energy into our parish, and by extension, more goodness into our lives.

Last Sunday, we had our official kickoff for "Name tag Sundays." This is one of the core strategies we are employing to build community and a culture of welcome in our parish. I want to thank Diane Peregine, in particular, from the Welcome and Hospitality Ministry for spearheading this effort. Along with Diane, several other members opened their hearts and offered their time to make this a success.

It was amazing to hear some of the conversations that were sparked simply by wearing a name tag and staying for coffee. For example, I met two parishioners who went to the same high school fifty years ago just one year apart, but never knew it until now! Imagine the conversations they must be having! I also met two other parishioners who are neighbors and never knew it! And so, we continue building community one person, one name tag, one conversation at a time.

Another initiative we've started is "prayer partners." If you attended either the 8 am, 10 am, or 12 pm Mass, you were asked to introduce yourself to another person whom you did not come with to Mass. At the intercessions, we then paused to pray for that person and his or her intentions. What we want to build over time is the expectation that when someone comes to St. Pius X for Mass, they know that they will meet someone who will then pray for their intentions during Mass. Praying together is another key strategy for building community. (We will continue this initiative at all Masses in the coming weeks; I just need to inform our visiting priests about our new practice).

I'd also like to thank everyone who planned and participated in our golf outing this week. A very special thanks to Tom Flood, Scott Litchfield, Tony Minella, and Liz Manning, who did an incredible amount of work behind the scenes, as well as everyone who was on the ground the day of. I'm already looking forward to next year!

A special thanks to everyone who donated to our Haiti collection, as well. We raised nearly \$5,000 for some of our most desperate brothers and sisters on the planet. Thanks to your generosity, we will help rebuild a medical center and an underground well that will provide clean water to an entire community. May this serve as a reminder to all of us what we're capable of when we come together!

Finally, a special welcome to all of our students and teachers this Catechetical Sunday! As we begin another year of religious education, I remind everyone about our new 'Family Mass" at 10 am, which will feature our *Day by Day* choir.

Everyone is also welcome to make use of our Family Chapel. Young children, in particular, naturally find it hard to sit still – and for an hour no less! They are most welcome to walk around, read a book, or rock in our rocking chairs if they need to expend some energy. Their presence at Mass brings great joy to my heart. And thank you, parents, for bringing them!

ST. PADRE PIO, original name Francesco Forgione, also called St. Pio of Pietrelcina, (born May 25, 1887, Pietrelcina, Italy—died September 23, 1968, San Giovanni Rotondo; canonized June 16, 2002; feast day September 23), Italian priest and saint of the Roman Catholic Church.



Born into a devout Roman Catholic family, he consecrated himself to Jesus at age 5. At age 15 he joined the Capuchin order and took the name Pio in honor of St. Pius I. In 1910, the year in which he became a priest, he received the stigmata (bodily marks corresponding to the wounds suffered by the crucified Jesus) for the first time, though they eventually healed. He was drafted into the Italian military in 1915 for medical service during World War I but was shortly discharged because of his poor health. He received the stigmata again in 1918, and this time they remained with him until his death. These and other signs of his holiness (such as his reported ability to be in two places at once and his gift of healing) drew growing numbers of pilgrims to him. He was noted for his charity and piety and was canonized in 2002 by Pope John Paul II.


