A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus says, "What is the Kingdom of God like? To what can I compare it? It is like a mustard seed that a man took and planted in the garden. When it was fully grown, it became a large bush" (Luke 13:18-19).

This is the strange, mysterious way God often works in the world – and in our own lives. He takes what seems small and insignificant and multiplies its growth beyond our wildest dreams.

This, I believe, will also be the story of St. Pius X. A few months ago, I preached on this theme: *St. Pius X: The Story of the Mustard Seed*. I then gave several examples of areas where we've witnessed incredible growth, including attendance, ministry expansion, giving, and the intangibles like joy and a sense of belonging.

I'd like to highlight another area today: our soup kitchen ministry, which we're rebranding as the ***Beyond Soup Ministry***. Six months ago, the soup kitchen was closed. Then Cilia and Vinny Galasso, and their daughter, Natalie, volunteered to open it back up. Today we have *twenty* volunteers! That's the story of a mustard seed – a closed kitchen is filled with volunteers in less than six months.

Due to our exponential growth, we're expanding the vision and mission of *Beyond Soup*. Volunteers within this ministry can not only prepare a weekly meal for the hungry in Newark; they can also prepare and bring meals to the sick and homebound locally. Some have even volunteered to drive seniors to doctors' appointments, to the grocery store, and so on. If you're either in need of help, or interested in getting involved, please contact Cilia Galasso at: ciliag51@gmail.com. May this mustard seed continue to grow, becoming "a large bush!"

On a sadder note, recently one of our beloved and long-time parishioners, Jack Welby, commended his brother, Tom, to the Lord. Due to various circumstances, a small funeral was celebrated for Tom immediately after his passing in New York. However, we will be celebrating a Mass of Remembrance in honor of Tom on Saturday, Nov. 6, 2021 @ 11 a.m.

A reception will follow in the narthex at 12 pm. I would like to thank in advance our volunteers from the *Welcome and Hospitality Ministry* who will be setting up the tables, coffee, and food in the narthex. As the Lord reminds us, "Whatever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters (certainly to those who are grieving), you do to me" (Matthew 25:40).

The High School Placement Test (HSPT) will be administered. The test is designed to measure scholastic aptitude in verbal and non-verbal abilities, and achievement in reading, mathematics, and language.

THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Moses commands the people to love and fear God, and always keep the commandments that they were given. He tells them to observe all statutes so that they will continue to grow and prosper, and tells them that they must love God with all their soul and strength.

Second Reading: Hebrews 7:23-28

Under the old covenant there were many priests, but Jesus will now remain high priest forever because he will live forever, and always be available to those who want to be saved. He does not need to offer sacrifice every day for the sins of his people, because he offered himself up in payment for their sins.

Gospel: Mark 12:28b-34

One of the scribes asked Jesus which commandment is the first, and he replied that the first is to love and honor the Lord and no one else. Jesus explained that they must love God with all their heart, and love their neighbor. The scribe agreed that loving God completely and loving one's neighbor is better than any sacrifice they could make.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

HIS WORD TODAY

“Moses spoke to the people saying, ‘Fear the Lord, your God, and keep throughout the days of your lives, all the statutes and commandments which I enjoin on you, and thus have long life. Hear then, Israel, and be careful to observe them that you may grow and prosper the more... Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your HEART, and with all your SOUL, and with all your STRENGTH. Take to heart these words which I enjoin on you today.’”

We may be able to recite the ten commandments, and remember that the first three reflect our relationship with God and the other seven, how we deal with our neighbor. We may recall that Jesus summarized them in just two, love of God and neighbor. We can even use one word, ‘respect’, to reflect the spirit of them all.

The commandments are the condition God offers if we are truly allowing Him to be our God and we, if we wish, to be His people. That is His promise and today we ask how good and sincere is our response.

The three signs of loving God with heart, soul and strength require that we do something to merit His promised reward. Prayer is our pacemaker, good works are our strengthening coach, and our desire to love is giving ourselves over to the Lord, body and soul.

Remember a sign seen outside a church: the commandments are not merely a suggestion, but are laws of God's faithful.
