The voice of despair says, "I sin over and over again. After endless promises to myself and others to do better next time, I find myself back again in the old dark places. Do not condemn yourself. Do not reject yourself. Let my love touch the deepest, most hidden corners of your heart and reveal to you your own beauty, a beauty that you have lost sight of, but that will become visible to you again in the light of my mercy. Come, come, let me wipe your tears, and let my mouth come close to your ear and say to you, 'I love you, I love you, I love you.'"

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

I will be on a silent retreat this week, returning on Friday, March 25th. Know that I will be praying for each of you, as always. Please also continue praying for me. Over the last year, we've seen just how much prayer can do – the Holy Spirit has begun to transform this parish into a vibrant family of faith. May the Spirit continue to inspire us as we grow!

The primary theme of my retreat will simply be gratitude. I'm so grateful for you, for this parish, and above all, for the gift of my faith. God has been so good to me – and to us. I want to take a few days away in the middle of Lent simply to thank him.

A word, then, on Lent. We've now reached the middle of our 40-day journey. How's it going for you so far? Has it been a fruitful journey? Has the Lord given you a word of comfort or inspiration? Perhaps you're still waiting for God to speak.

One image I often pray with during Lent is that of an old car radio. You may remember back when radios were built with a dial. You had to turn the knob to the left or the right in order to find the right station. One click too far created static, muffling the music.

Isn't that what Lent is all about – making adjustments, fine tuning our spiritual lives, searching for the voice of the Lord?

Given we've been on our Lenten journeys for nearly a month now, do we need to make any adjustments?

Maybe we need to dial down time spent on social media or watching the news in order to turn up time spent in prayer. Maybe we even need a silent day away.

Maybe we need to decrease slightly our portion size at meals in order to increase our awareness of the poor, especially those without food in Ukraine. Maybe the Lord is inviting us to grow in patience, generosity, or some other virtue.

Just as we'd expect to hear a musician's voice if we turned on the radio, so we should expect to hear the Lord this Lent. It may just be a matter of making the right adjustments – of tuning out, and tuning in. In the words of Samuel, our friend from the Old Testament, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening" (1 Samuel 3:10).

As caring adults, we have the great responsibility of ensuring the safety of children and youth. The prevention of child sexual abuse requires adult awareness, education, and training about the nature and scope of the problem.

The first pillar of our mission is, **"Building Community."** As our community continues to grow, we want to ensure the safety and protection of our all our children, building a common culture of safety and awareness.

It is now required by the Archdiocese of Newark that **all (St. Pius X Parish) Volunteers** who come into contact with minors, attend a Protecting God's Children for Adult Workshop and authorize a background check.

Registration is required and can be done through our parish app or directly through the Virtus website at <https://www.virtus.org>

WORSHIPPING GOD

Fourth Sunday of Lent (Year C) bulletin

Hymn of the Week: Psalm 34, "Taste and see that the Lord is good," by Stephen Dean

Psalm 34 is known as one of the "common psalms" in our liturgical calendar. Everyone can sing from memory at least one of the many musical settings of "Taste and see..." For this Fourth Sunday of Lent, we will sing a setting by Stephen Dean. I don't usually favor repetitions within the psalm refrain, but the musical form Dean uses clearly calls for it. Sometimes once just isn't enough! (I'm reminded of Dr. Seuss' Green Eggs and Ham, "You do not like them so you say, try them, *try them*, and you may I say!")

*Taste and see, taste and see,
that the Lord is good,
the Lord is good.*

We have the Second Vatican Council to thank for the singing of the Responsorial Psalm in the format we all now know as "call and response." It is not called "responsorial" only because the refrain is repeated after each verse as a response, but also because it is considered a response to the First Reading.

Singing the Psalm during Mass was the tradition as far back as the fifth and sixth centuries! Then, musicians got a hold of them, and the music became too elaborate for the assembly to participate, and the practice disappeared for almost 1500 years. Not only did Vatican II reinstate the singing of the Responsorial Psalm, they also reinstated the role of the cantor or psalmist, which has in turn led to the development of the music ministry as the leaders of song for the entire Mass, not just the Psalm.

I can't imagine Mass any other way, especially since many of our Day By Day Singers are now trained as psalmists (don't they do a great job?). Enjoy your role in the Mass by singing scripture, and may we never take for granted the gift of music as a form of worship.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2022 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal quantity.**

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the law of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, March 6th to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 12, 2022.**

*Canon 920, §1. *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*
