A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Part of the joy of belonging to St. Pius X is the sense that we're always building; trying out something new; growing in different ways.

For example, last Sunday at the 10 AM Mass, I decided to introduce the readings. After having celebrated the 4:30 p.m. Mass on Saturday and the 8 am that Sunday morning, it struck me how inaccessible the readings can seem at times. What does the story of a prophet from 3,000 years ago have to do with our own lives today? In last week's first reading, for example, we heard the story of the prophets Elijah and Elisha. Elijah was reaching the end of his prophetic ministry and Elisha was chosen to take his place. Like many biblical characters, Elisha was hesitant at first; he tried making a few excuses to postpone the inevitable. He needed to accept — as we all do at times — that the Lord had a plan for his life, one that would lead to life in abundance. Eventually, Elisha accepts his mission, and he becomes one of the early building blocks in the life and faith of Israel. His story continues to resonate with us today.

After having received a considerable amount of positive feedback from a number of you, I will continue to offer brief introductions to the readings. We all come to Mass hoping the Lord will speak to us; sometimes the word we may need to hear comes from either the first or second reading. My hope is that in breaking open the scriptures with a brief introduction, it may open your heart a little more to hear the Lord speak.

As I write this pastoral letter, I can hear our children in Summer CCD playing joyfully outside. Here's to another successful program! I would like to thank Maria Charowsky, DRE, Christine Arthur, assistant to the DRE, Pat Boscia, our parish sacristan, and all our teachers, parents, and volunteers who made this week not only possible, but also a success.

My hope in the coming years is that we continue to teach our children by our words and actions the beauty of our Catholic faith. Bringing them to Mass and CCD are two important ways, but also the ways in which we live out our faith in our own lives; how we treat one another; how we pray in front of them; and how we remain faithful to the Lord all the days of our lives.

As we will hear in this Sunday's Gospel, every Christian is meant to be "sent out," to share the Good News with the world.

What an honor to share – and to live – the Gospel with all of you.

ST. PIUS X FINANCIAL REPORT

This executive summary from the Finance Council covers the Q3 2022 period from January 1, 2022, to March 31, 2022. This is the second in a series of more frequent financial reports to be shared with all parishioners of SPXOT. Our goal is to have more transparency and more frequent financial reporting that is inclusive of our overall financial health and plans going forward.

In working through a repeatable process with a well understood methodology we have encountered a few challenges.

- Budget to Actual clearly an approach we wish to work towards doesn't make sense, yet, given the year we based the initial budget on, COVID, no Mass, no fundraising, few programs being implemented in FY 2021.
- We have reported for years now that our number one issue is revenue (donations)
- We recently contracted a number of long overdue service contracts and evaluations of our physical plant (building and systems)

Our initial approach is very simple: just report on all the cash on hand and all the known liabilities at this point in time. We have been improving our budget process with a wide array of inputs from Parish Council, Finance Council and Fr Kevin as Pastor. We will work towards Budget to Actuals on a quarterly basis as our management and reporting processes improve.

Special NOTES relevant to Heritage Fund:

- We approved a contract to replace all 10 HVAC units each of which are 24 years old and have surpassed their useful life. This contract has a 0% interest rate with a 5 yr payout of \$183,690 payable monthly starting the month all the units have been installed. Monthly liability is \$3062 from the Heritage Fund.
- We approved playground and sports court projects. Approximately \$100,000
- Installation of security system approximately \$8000
- Cleaning and sealing of the entire church marble flooring, first time in 23 years. \$9000
