A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Many of you know now the three pillars of our mission: Building Community. Worshiping God. Making Disciples. It defines who we are and what we believe in as a parish; it's what makes us unique. Over the last two years, we've put a significant amount of effort into that first pillar of our mission, Building Community, through the creation of our SPX café, the construction of our playground and basketball court, and parish-wide events like the new parishioner luncheon. As a result, we've grown by 100 families in the last two years! Some are returning parishioners, others are new. Many have been invited to, "Come and see!"

The bond of our community is strong. I hope each person knows they belong here. So, now my pastoral focus is moving deeper into "mission territory," into the pillars of: Worshiping God and Making Disciples. The latter is really our "make or break" standard as a parish. A disciple is anyone who loves Jesus and shares that love with others. While we all love the Lord and do our best to share our faith with others, we also know that growing in faith is a life-long journey. This is the place where our faith should be stretched, nurtured, and enriched. This is where we learn how to become life-long disciples.

To that end, we will begin focusing more on faith formation. I envision creating more events for adults like ALPHA (an evangelization program that a few parishioners are currently participating in), and a speaker-series involving a variety of topics. Recently, Sister Mary Foley offered a talk on Advent. We then offered a follow-up talk from the former Mother Superior of her order, Sister Mary Maher, who presented a beautiful reflection on the love of God. Last week, we were grateful to have Roger Davidoff, who gave an insightful lecture on Christian art in the Italian Renaissance. There will be two more lectures from Roger leading up to Easter. I also hope to offer more opportunities to experience our faith through pilgrimages and service-based opportunities.

We also need to dedicate a considerable amount of time and effort into forming our youth. One way I am seeking to do this is through World Youth Day, which will take place in August 2023, in Lisbon, Portugal. There, young people between the ages of 18-35 will be able to see the pope and interact with Catholics from around the world. I'm delighted to share that I'm leading a group of over thirty people from the Archdiocese of Newark, including two of our own parishioners, Chris Capazzi and Matthew Olivo! Wishing you all a fruitful Advent journey as we make our way towards Christmas.

WORSHIPPING GOD

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14

Ahaz receives from Isaiah a prophecy that he will be successful in war and is urged to ask for a sign that the prophecy is true. The sign is "The virgin shall be with child and bear a son and shall name him Emmanuel."

Second Reading: Romans 1:1-7

Paul greets the Romans by pointing out that Jesus is the Christ who was promised to them in Scripture. He, Paul, is the apostle favored with the task of spreading the name of Christ to all.

Gospel: Matthew 1:18-24

In a brief, straightforward, simple narrative, Matthew recounts the events leading to Jesus' birth. He details the appearance of the angel in a dream to Joseph and stresses that "All this happened to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophets."

Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 18, 2022

"A servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle and set apart to proclaim the gospel of God, which he promised long ago through his prophets...through him we have been favored with apostleship that we my spread his name and bring to obedient faith all the gentiles, among whom are you who have been called to belong to Jesus Christ."

Paul was keenly aware of his call and mission, but it did not end with him. We have been gifted with the same call through our baptism to spread His name today.

As we joyfully celebrate the Lord's birth this week, what better time for us than now to resolve to reach out to someone who has grown weak in the faith, been consumed by the idols of consumerism, or who place trust in things and not in the person of Jesus Christ.
