A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

I hope everyone had a blessed Christmas! This was the most joy-filled Christmas I've had in a number of years. To begin, our Mass celebrations were beautiful. The music, in particular, was incredibly uplifting. As I've said to Sara, our Director of Music: "This is the first parish I've been in where the music elevates my worship." She did a terrific job in making diverse selections so that each Mass was a little different.

At our 4:30 pm on Christmas Eve, she utilized our Day by Day Singers, including new instrumentalists like Gavin Clarke, who played the violin; Mia Remengio, who played the cello; Wyatt Remengio, who played the violin; and Samantha Fernandez and Wyatt who used the hand chimes. Seeing our own young people participate and grow as musicians is incredibly rewarding. Please join me in thanking Sara, our choir members, and their families who made this possible.

It was also wonderful seeing John Kullberg and his son, Jared, play together at the 6:30 p.m. John was joined by members of our new guitar club, who led us in a folksier celebration. Their renditions of a number of Christmas carols, including songs written by John, were uplifting. Our adult Fellowship Choir also did a fantastic job at the 10 am. They really fill the church with praise! I know Sara is always looking for new talent, so if you feel motivated by the Holy Spirit to join any of these groups, please don't hesitate to reach out to either me or her at: music@spxot.org. Aside from our own musicians, Sara also brought in several very talented singers for a few of our Masses, all of whom I'm grateful for.

I also want to thank our parish staff, our volunteer ushers, our SPX Bakers, Eucharistic Ministers, altar servers, lectors, money counters, greeters, those who purify our linens, and everyone who showed up this Christmas to celebrate the birth of our Lord.

It was a packed weekend. As many of you either witnessed, or have heard, our 4:30 pm Mass was beyond full capacity. Standing room only was an understatement! In our planning for future holiday Masses, we will do our best to schedule times that work for as many parishioners as possible in order to accommodate schedules, etc. I will ask the Pastoral Council to consider issuing another survey to include a preference for holiday Mass times like Easter and Christmas.

As you will see, our weekly I holiday collection has also been rising. I cannot thank you enough for your continued generosity! Your support enables our parish to plan for things like: the church painting — collected in our Heritage Fund, and paying for our operating costs (like heat, water, gas, staff, lights, etc.), which comes from the general collection. I've also shared my goal with the finance council of starting to set aside a "rainy day" fund, which will not be spent during my tenure. Over the next several years, my goal is to raise 6 months' worth of operating costs so that our parish can enjoy greater financial security. I understand the momentum we are experiencing is unique; while we are fortunate to make a number of upgrades to our facilities, we also have to plan responsibly for the future.

Speaking of futures, I wish everyone a very blessed and happy New Year!

THE SOLEMNITY OF MARY, MOTHER OF GOD

New Year's is a day of new beginnings, goals, celebrations, and reflections. And it's also one of the most special days in the Church – **the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God**. One week after we celebrate the birth of Christ, we give thanks to His mother. This solemnity is also the final day in the Octave of Christmas and the World Day of Peace.

History & Church Teaching

Throughout history, there have been many movements to establish a feast honoring Mary as the Mother of God and Mother of the Church. However, this solemnity only became an official one in the 20th century.

On February 2, 1974, Pope Paul VI encouraged the restoration of the Solemnity of Mary, the holy Mother of God, in his apostolic exhortation Marialis Cultus:

"In the revised ordering of the Christmas period it seems to us that the attention of all should be directed towards the restored Solemnity of Mary the holy Mother of God. This celebration, placed on January 1 in conformity with the ancient indication of the liturgy of the City of Rome, is meant to commemorate the part played by Mary in this mystery of salvation."

He stated the complementary nature of the three solemnities which celebrate Mary

Immaculate Conception: "Recognize the beginning of the Church, the spotless Bride of Christ"

Assumption: "Recognize the beginning that has already been made and the image of what, for the whole Church, must still come to pass"

Mary, Mother of God: "She is the Mother of the Head and of the members – the holy Mother of God and therefore the provident Mother of the Church"

All three solemnities are essential to the Church's understanding and admiration of Mary. The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, presents us with a unique way of starting the new year. Just after the birth of Christ, we enter the new year accompanied by Mary, the Queen of Heaven, Mother of the Prince of Peace.

Dear Lord, help me look to Mary as my guide in navigating this life's many ups and downs.

Help me seek her peace such that I may rest with You.

Mary, please accompany me in my journey to your Son, Jesus.

Wrap me in your mantle and give me the strength to seek Him in all I do.

Amen.
