ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

St. Pius X Parishioners and guests are very fortunate to have the opportunity to experience the warm and welcoming presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament during our Holy Hour every first Tuesday of each month after the 9:00 a.m. Mass and from 5:00-7:00 p.m. All are invited to join us on Tuesday, February 7, 2023.

What Do I Do During Eucharistic Adoration?

If you attend Adoration, as a form of respect, you should always genuflect when you see the Lord in the Host. Maintain an attitude of respect, and if others are present, silence. On retreats or other special occasions, there may be music playing to help foster a spirit of prayer, worship, and Adoration. Always keep in mind that you are in the presence of God!

Kneeling, sitting, and standing, before the Blessed Sacrament are all appropriate forms of prayer. Let your posture reflect your worship of the King and do what is comfortable for you.

You really don't have to "do" anything during Adoration. You can just sit there and look at Jesus. Take the time to be with Him. If you are the only person in the church, don't be afraid to pray or sing aloud. This is your personal time with Christ.

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

There are a number of important things to announce this week: contracts, important dates, and new ministries.

On Monday, I signed the contracts for the sound system (including upgrades for livestreaming) and painting the interior of the church. If all goes according to schedule (say a prayer), then the sound system will be installed starting on Monday, February 6. We expect to have the project completed by Friday, February 10.

The painting of the church will begin on Monday, February 27. We've blocked out ten days for the project, meaning we should only be without the interior church for one weekend, March 4-5. That weekend, we will likely celebrate Mass in the narthex. The project should be completed by Friday, March 10. Please stay tuned for further updates.

We also have three new ministries to announce: an events committee, a yoga ministry, and a cooking ministry.

For a complete description of the events committee, please see the message from our Pastoral Council in this week's bulletin. Here's a basic overview: the events committee will be charged with the responsibility of overseeing all parish events. Hence, we are looking for people with planning and organizational skills, as well as those who enjoy creating social / ministerial events.

The yoga ministry is kicking off on Monday, February 27, at 1:30 p.m. The number of sign-ups will determine its location on campus. We will begin by offering it for five weeks. Mark your calendar! (Mondays: February 27, March 6, 13, 20, and 27). It will be a "mixed levels" class, allowing room for anyone from beginner to expert. Please either sign up on the app or call the office for more information.

Our cooking ministry will be kicking off on Thursday, February 9. The first eight people to sign up (please call the office) are welcome! We will be cooking Beth Litchfield's famous "Heart Healthy Chili and cornbread." All participants will make the recipe together in the soup kitchen. Then you'll be able to share it together and take the rest – and the recipe – home!

WORSHIPPING GOD

5TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Brothers and sisters of St Pius X,

James E. Moore, Jr., beloved composer of "Taste and See" (our Communion hymn this week) has gone home to be with our Lord and sing in His heavenly choir. His life is being memorialized all around the United States and Europe, and I'd like to take a moment to honor his contribution to the Catholic Liturgical Music repertoire.

Moore, a native of La Crosse, Virginia, was born in 1951 and gained fame during the Black Catholic Movement as one of several notable composers who began fusing Black gospel stylings with Catholic hymnody. (Fusion of styles is what the SPX Music Ministry is all about!) Perhaps the most famous result of that exploration, Moore's Eucharistic tune "Taste and See," was composed in 1983 and has become a staple in Catholic parishes around the country and beyond, both as a Communion hymn and as a responsorial setting of Psalm 34. In 1987, the song was included in the inaugural edition of Lead Me Guide Me, the nation's first Black Catholic hymnal. Moore served as Music Director in various US parishes, traveled extensively, and eventually settled in Vienna, Austria where he was still teaching, composing, and conducting when the Lord called his name.

A handful of SPX parishioners have requested more Gospel music at our Masses. Ask and ye shall receive! Let us honor Moore's contribution by raising our voices together, contemplating the divine intervention that brought forth this powerful, testimonial-style hymn. It is truly an example of God working through us.

Requiescat in peace. May he now see for himself the goodness of the Lord.

Glorify the Lord with me,

Together let us all praise His name!

I called the Lord and He answered me.

From all my troubles I was set free.

Taste and see the goodness of the Lord.
