FIND THE SOURCE OF YOUR LONELINESS

Whenever you feel lonely, you must try to find the source of this feeling. You are inclined either to run away from your loneliness or to dwell in it. When you run away from it, your loneliness does not really diminish; you simply force it out of your mind temporarily. When you start dwelling in it, your feelings only become stronger, and you slip into depression.

The spiritual task is not to escape your loneliness, not to let yourself drown in it, but to find its source. This is not so easy to do, but when you can somehow identify the place from which these feelings emerge, they will lose some of their power over you. This identification is not an intellectual task; it is a task of the heart. With your heart you must search for that place without fear.

This is an important search because it leads you to discern something good about yourself. The pain of your loneliness may be rooted in your deepest vocation. You might find that your loneliness is linked to your call to live completely for God. Thus your loneliness may be revealed to you as the other side of your unique gift. Once you can experience in your innermost being the truth of this, you may find your loneliness not only tolerable but even fruitful. What seemed primarily painful may then become a feeling that, though painful, opens for you the way to an even deeper knowledge of God's love.

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

As I write this weekly letter, the family chapel is filled with parishioners adoring our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. This may be the first time that we've had Eucharistic Adoration in the chapel. It was a beautiful sight to see so many praying, and I'm sure some were praying for our beloved community.

The world itself is in need of prayer. I think of places like Ukraine, Turkey, and Syria, where stability has given way to instability; peace has given way to war; countless hearts, homes, and lives have been shattered. The tragic scenes making headlines remind me of what happened in the Book of Genesis — only in reverse.

Each day this week, our first reading for daily Mass has come from the Book of Genesis. The author describes how God created the cosmos. "In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, and the earth was without form or shape, with darkness over the abyss... God said, 'Let there be light, and there was light..."

Genesis teaches us an important lesson about God and our world: only God orders the chaos; only God turns darkness into light; only God makes crooked ways straight; only God turns death into life. It must feel in faraway places like Ukraine that the world is sliding back into the formless waste it once was in the Book of Genesis. Even in our own hearts, there may be times when we feel a sense of being lost or broken within. But scripture reminds us that God can bring order and peace once again. Perhaps we can say the famous prayer of St. Francis for all who are in need of the Holy Spirt, the giver of all good gifts:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace: where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy.

O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen.

THE SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Sirach 15:15-20

This passage from Sirach gives strong, unequivocal emphasis to free will in every person. Before each of us is set, sin or virtue, life or death, and each of us are free to choose the one or the other.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:6-10

Paul explains to the Corinthians that there are two different kinds of wisdom — the wisdom of God and the wisdom of the world. The wisdom of God is mysterious, but this wisdom has been revealed "to those who love him" through the Spirit.

Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells the people he has come to fulfill the law. He speaks strongly against murder and anger, against adultery and lust, and against false oaths and lies. He warns the people that unless their virtue exceeds that of the Pharisees, they "will not enter the kingdom of God."

"If you choose you can keep the commandments, they will save you; trust in God, you too shall live... Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him... The eyes of God are on those who fear him; he understands man's every need."
