SAINT JOSEPH

The mention of St. Joseph conjures up thoughts of a holy man, the spouse of Mary, earthly father of Jesus and a hard-working carpenter. Although he's one of the most-recognized saints, little is known about him.

In the Bible, he is referred to as a "just man," which was considered a high compliment in his time. It also meant that he was willing and open to do whatever God asked of him, including taking Mary as his wife, despite her unusual – and blessed pregnancy (Matthew 1:19). He also loved and cared for Jesus. St. Joseph protected his family, heeding the Lord's direction, which came in a series of dreams and messages from angels.

He has two feast days: March 19 is the traditional feast day of **St. Joseph, husband of Mary** that has been on the liturgical calendar for many years – dating to about the 10th century. May 1, the **feast of St. Joseph the Worker**, was established in 1955 by Pope Pius XII.

Many people pray to St. Joseph for intercession, including praying novenas, a nine-day series of prayers or devotions. It is believed that St. Joseph died before Jesus began his public ministry. St. Joseph is known as the patron saint of the Universal Church, a happy death, families, fathers, expectant mothers, explorers, pilgrims, travelers, immigrants, home sellers and buyers, craftsmen, engineers and working people. Also, many cities and countries are dedicated to him.

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Wishing everyone a blessed, joyful Saint Patrick's Day (weekend). At first thought, we may associate this holiday with parades, dancing, soda bread, even rivers dyed green. But behind this feast is the story of a man whose faith and courage transformed a nation.

When he was only a boy, Patrick was kidnapped by Irish raiders and sold into slavery. He spent the next several years suffering terribly from hunger and the cold. Eventually, he escaped from his captors and made his way back home to Britain, where he entered the seminary, was ordained a priest, and spent the next 20 years in ministry.

One night, however, Patrick had a dream. A voice with an Irish accent pleaded with him, "We appeal to you, to come and walk among us."

Patrick felt strongly that this call came from the LORD, so he returned to Ireland a free man. He would spend the next – and final – 28 years of his life sharing the Gospel with the Irish. Today 90% of Ireland identifies as Catholic!

We rely upon the same Holy Spirit to help us share – and live – the Gospel with our family, co-workers, neighbors, and friends. It's my hope and strong belief that, together, we can create a tiny slice of "Ireland" here at St. Pius X, meaning we create a community that is in constant growth and that lives, and loves, our faith. May Saint Patrick pray for us!

I'd like to extend a word of gratitude to Cilia Galasso, Lucia Passante, Carolyn Morro, Diane Peragine, Roberta Manganaro, Valeri Parker, Mary Lombino, Laura Green, Kathy Shields, Natalie Glaasso, Eleanor Bradley, Jim Flynn, and Vinny Glasso, who helped prepare our Saint Patrick's Day Senior Luncheon on Wednesday. 

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2023 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal quantity.**

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the law of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 26th to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 4, 2023.**

*Canon 920, §1. *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

Stewardship, quite simply, is recognizing that everything we have and everything we are is a gift from God and being grateful with those gifts. God reveals His perfect love for us most visibly in His Son, Jesus Christ. A steward makes God's love visible by imitating Jesus.


