# **A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN**

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

What a week it's been! The graces that are flowing out of our parish pilgrimage to Fatima, and from Our Lady's pilgrimage throughout the Archdiocese, are truly amazing... and this is only the beginning! It was an honor to bring your intentions to the Shrine of Fatima, and to leave them at the Chapel of the Apparitions. A special thanks to Beth Litchfield, who carried our intercessions throughout the trip and made sure they were left in the hands of Our Lady.

Upon our arrival back here at St. Pius X, we were greeted by CBS News, who filmed and interviewed **Ricardo Casimiro** (my co-leader) and me. The pilgrimage of Our Lady quickly made the evening news, and the news cycle again the next morning. This helped spread the word about her six-week pilgrimage throughout the Archdiocese. You can follow her by referencing our website.

I also want to encourage you to attend our procession for peace on May 13, which is the feast day of the first apparition. On May 13, 1917, Our Lady appeared to three children, Francisco, Jacinta, and Lucia, and told them, **"I am from heaven."** This began the six-month series of apparitions by Our Lady to them. The central meaning behind her message was peace and conversion. We are all called to work for peace and to pray for the conversion of sinners. In particular, I'd encourage you to march with us as we pray peace in Ukraine and Sudan, a spirit of renewal within our Archdiocese, peace within our families, and a spirit of gratitude for all the Lord has done with and for us here at St. Pius X.

The pilgrimage starts at 1:30 pm at Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Newark. We will process together with Our Lady to the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Newark. I will be the main celebrant for the Vigil Mass at 5 pm. After Mass, Ricardo will offer a reflection on Fatima, then we will pray a rosary together. It will be an allday event, but an incredible opportunity for our young people, in particular, to witness our faith in a new way. We are expecting at least two-thousand people in the procession. Come and see!

We have reserved a bus, which will leave St. Pius X at 12:00 p.m. and will return by 8:30 p.m. If you are interested in reserving a seat, please sign up on the app. Space is limited! The bus has been paid for by an anonymous donor.

I'll end on a note of gratitude: A special thanks to Kathy Shields and Cilia Galasso who prepared the church for Our Lady's arrival, as well as all who greeted us upon our return. Thanks to the Knights of Columbus, too, who stood watch by Our Lady for the duration of her stay here at St. Pius X. Let's continue to pray that her pilgrimage here within the Archdiocese would bear good fruit.

# FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

#### First Reading: Acts 6:1-7

During the early growth of the Church, the apostles realized that they needed more disciples in order to carry out effectively the ministry of the Church. The community selected seven men, one of whom was Stephen.

#### Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:4-9

Citing many uses of the word "stone" in the sayings of Jesus and in the Old Testament, Peter urges the Christians to be "living stones...an edifice of spirit."

#### Gospel: John 14:1-12

In this beautiful passage from the words of Jesus at the Last Supper, Jesus promises that he is preparing a place for the apostles. He tells them, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through me." When Philip asks Jesus to show them the Father, Jesus answers, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father."

# A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS **HIS WORD TODAY**, *by Rev. William J. Reilly*

"Brothers (and Sisters) select from among you seven reputable men filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and the ministry of the word... They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid their hands on them. The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly..."

As you read this passage from the Acts of the Apostles, consider your parish, your faith sharing group, your own community. What happened in Jerusalem was part of God's plan then, and it is God's plan for us now. There was a need, and a choice, for something new was so necessary. Prayer, discernment and action followed.

The same process is not limited to those called to be deacons. Some years ago we found many involved in Catholic Action, people responding to their baptismal call, not to maintain the church or parish, but to evangelize and grow in faith and numbers. Allow others to know Jesus who said He is THE way and THE truth and THE life. 'No one comes to the Father, except through me.'

May our group, our parish, our society live these words. Yes, like Philip in the gospel today, we say 'Master show us the Father and that will be enough for us.'
