A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Please join me in congratulating our newest class of Confirmation students! Last Sunday at 2:30 pm, Bishop Saporito joined us for Mass. In spite of having nearly lost his voice, he pushed through, offering both a prayerful liturgy and an inspiring homily.

He used an interesting image to describe the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. He asked the congregation, "Who here likes popcorn?" Of course, I raised my hand. He went on to describe the process of making popcorn. No one chews on kernels; that'd crack your teeth! There's a microscopic amount of water inside each kernel. When heated, that causes steam until finally, *POP!* The kernel is transformed into popcorn.

Similarly, when we're baptized, we receive the Holy Spirit, much like a drop of water. At Confirmation, we publicly profess our belief in God, which was given to us at baptism. The Sacrament of Confirmation is an appointed moment when that "popping" can occur within; with an open heart, God can transform our lives, always from the inside out.

What about us? Most, if not all of us have been baptized, and many confirmed. Do we feel that transformative heat of the Holy Spirit within? Or where might we need God's power to work? Personally, I pray to the Holy Spirit for the gifts of wisdom, humility, creativity, and renewal – that I would personally be renewed by grace each day, and that I'd have the wisdom needed to lead our parish forward as the Lord desires.

What do you pray for?

I will bring these intentions to the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima, as I return this Sunday, June 11. Ricardo Casimiro and I will return the Pilgrim Statue of Our Lady to Fatima, then participate in the candlelit procession on Monday night, followed by Mass on Tuesday, June 13th. On Wednesday, we will finalize some administrative tasks in preparation for our group of 45 to travel for World Youth Day in August. I'll be back home on Thursday, June 15th.

Please keep Ricardo and I in your prayers! Please also remember the young people who will be traveling with us from within the Archdiocese this August to Portugal, including three parishioners from St. Pius X. May the same Holy Spirit who anointed our Confirmation students last week, be with those traveling to World Youth Day.

I also want to thank in advance all who came out for our Mass with Bishop Saporito on Saturday, June 10th, which concludes the pilgrimage of Our Lady throughout the Archdiocese of Newark. I pray that both Mass and the candlelit procession was a spiritually uplifting experience.

WORSHIPPING GOD

First Reading: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a

He tells them, in mysterious and beautiful words, that the bread he gives is his flesh and says, "I myself am the living bread... If anyone eats this bread, he shall live forever."

HIS WORD TODAY, by Rev. William J. Reilly

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ ~ June 11, 2023

"Then taking the five loaves and two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, he broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up they filled twelve wicker baskets."

How would I have felt if I was in the crowd, listening and learning, and hungry? I sat down and observed Him taking and breaking, praying and blessing, and then giving to the disciples and they to the crowd. I reach out and gratefully accept this gift.

Take a minute and apply that scene to your presence at Holy Mass today. We are taught in the word and then watch, pray and listen as Jesus becomes truly present in the bread and wine – 'MY BODY... MY BLOOD.' NOT A SYMBOL BUT A REAL PRESENCE. Our faith focuses on His coming to me in the sacrament. When I leave liturgy, I too leave satisfied.

May I express my faith in His presence and reverently receive and consume the most important moment for Catholics.


