A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

I'd like to begin by thanking all who either participated in or attended our Christmas pageant. There were two moments, in particular, that left a lasting impression on me. The first came during the dress rehearsal. Seeing the children so excited – almost jumping out of their skin with anticipation – reminded me again why we are putting so much effort into re-imaging out faith formation program. There was an emotion present in the faith formation wing that evening which we want to consistently build upon, the mark of a Christian disciple: joy.

Secondly, one of our final songs was Silent Night. I turned the lights down in church, allowing the candles our children were holding to shine brightly. There must've been 200 parents, children, staff, and volunteers singing to our Lord together. As the children were huddled together in their costumes around the altar – Mary, Joseph, John the Baptist, angels, animals, and that Providential star – there was a sense of wonder – awe – that filled the church. That, to me, is the beginning and the end of faith: a sense of awe, knowing that God is near. The Lord is both with us and within us.

As we continue journeying together into a revitalized faith formation program, which utilizes "focus experiences" like the Christmas pageant, making an Advent wreath, or a Nativity scene, I believe our children will experience our Catholic faith in a new, deeper way. We are always in search of volunteers, as well (even for an hour!) Our search for a permanent Director of Music continues. I have assembled a search committee of seven people, myself included, who represent various interests in the parish: faith formation, staff, pastoral council, finance council, and the choir. We've had a number of applications and hope to make a decision in the near future. In the interim, I'd like to thank Debra Wyka, our interim Director of Music, who has generously and lovingly led us through this transition. She has been a blessing to us all. I also want to thank all who have donated to our various Christmas charities – St. Joseph's in Jersey City, the Giving Tree, and our sock drive. As the Lord teaches us, "Whatever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters, you do to me" (Matthew 25:40).

WORSHIPPING GOD

THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 61:1-2a, 10-11

Isaiah describes the joy and salvation which will accompany the coming of Christ. He compares the plants which spring from a garden to the justice that will spring from all nations.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

Paul reminds the Thessalonians to constantly ready themselves for Christ's arrival. He tells them to "avoid any semblance of evil" so that they may be found irreproachable when Jesus does arrive.

Gospel: John 1:6-8, 19-28

John explains that he is only a messenger to the people for one more powerful than himself. John stresses to them that they must make a path for the one so powerful that he is not fit to unfasten the strap of his sandal.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

"Rejoice always, never cease praying, render constant thanks; such is God's will for you. Do not stifle the Spirit. Do not despise prophecies. Test everything; retain what is good. Avoid any semblance of evil. May the God of peace make you perfect in holiness. May you be preserved whole and entire, spirit, soul and body, irreproachable at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. He who calls us is trustworthy, therefore he will do it."

Living the final days of Advent, Saint Paul offers a game plan for prayer and action. We have heard the prophet speak. We have met John the Baptist and accepted his message of repentance and renewal. What more can be done? It is something we dare not avoid - our personal call to holiness.

Set aside a few minutes each day, look into your heart, see what the Lord sees, thanking Him for His blessings, but also ask help to set aside whatever can block the Lord giving you His peace. 'Come Lord Jesus.'


