A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

I'm over-the-moon delighted to share the good news with you! Our crucifix has been installed! The smaller crucifix that was previously over the altar in the main church has been returned to its original position in the family chapel.

A few things about our new crucifix:

It was made in Spain by Granda, perhaps the best company in the world for liturgical artwork. It took seven months to construct, hand carve, paint, and ship.

It is true to size in weight and scale. Meaning, the body of our Lord is 6 feet and the crucifix is 9 feet. So, what you see is a life-sized depiction of Our Lord as he would've been on Calvary. The weight is also comparable to the real-life dimensions – 350 pounds (the weight of Our Lord's body combined with his cross).

The crucifix is hand carved, made out of Linden wood, a tree popular in parts of the northern hemisphere, particularly in Europe. Linden trees produce soft and easily worked timber, which made it a popular choice for intricate carving, including for Germanic shields.

It is also one of a kind. Granda took images of the crucifix that was previously over the altar, made it life-sized, then they added color. My intention for doing this was to keep the original design – an ode to our past – while enriching it.

This is a gift that is meant to inspire devotion to Our Lord. As we enter the church, our eyes are immediately drawn to him. Each individual is prompted to ask, "Who is this man?" ... As Saint Paul tells us in his Letter to the Romans, "For Christ, while we were still helpless, died at the appointed time for the ungodly... But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:6-8).

You'll also notice the crucifix is hanging in the air, with the light-blue backdrop of the ceiling behind him. This is meant to give the impression that Our Lord is suspended somewhere between heaven and earth. As John of the Cross once said, "The Cross stands still as the world turns." It is a timeless reminder of what the Mass is, the "new and eternal covenant" between God and his people.

I'm deeply grateful for the family that anonymously donated this crucifix. It is truly a one-time work of art. I'd also like to thank Bob Zaccone, chair of the Capital Projects committee, who helped to oversee the installation; Jim Dolan, a parishioner who stored and delivered the cross for us; as well as Nick Aversa and his team who did the actual installation. I first met Nick through Tom and Annie Daidone, both parishioners and friends.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, I hope you are as inspired by this incredible display of God's love for us as I am.

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

The Epiphany of the Lord ~ January 7, 2024

"You have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for your benefit. It was not made known to people of other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners of the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel."

On this day when we commemorate the coming of the Magi, the Wise Men, with three gifts, and their discovery of Mary with the child, we ask what that means for me today. Saint Paul speaks of three things. We are coheirs' of the gift of grace and redemption. We are, as he states in his letters, 'members of the body of Christ', and copartners.

We have been gifted, but also become responsible to bring what has been given to others. This responsibility is an awesome task for which we are held accountable. We learned the three kings returned home, and have heard nothing more about their experience. That cannot be what is expected of us, who discover the presence of the Lord and the protection of His Mother.




