A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Our journeys with Jesus continue in the desert on this Second Sunday of Lent. As I preached in last week's sermon, Lent is not about giving up chocolate or coffee for forty days as much as it is a type of training; just as soldiers train for battle and athletes train for competition, we are training ourselves to rely more upon the Lord (we are building our "ark") before the flood waters of trial or temptation arise. As the Psalmist wisely notes, "Every person should pray to you in time of distress. Though flood waters may reach high, you [the believer] they shall not overcome. You are my shelter, O LORD; you guard me from distress; with joyful shouts of deliverance you surround me" (Psalm 32:6-7). How is your Lenten journey going so far?

While our focus was on Christ in the desert last week, this week we encounter the Lord on top of Mount Tabor, where the Transfiguration takes place. "Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them" (Mark 9:2-3). This was not only meant to me a moment of consolation for Peter, James, and John, but also to us on our Lenten journeys, reminding us that we are following the Lord because this path of faith, obedience, self-discipline, and sacrifice leads to life in abundance.

There's one particular detail about this Gospel passage that's always stuck out to me. While Jesus is glowing before his disciples, Moses and Elijah also appear, speaking with Jesus. (Peter and the others can only watch in awe). Moses and Elijah were significant figures from the Old Testament – Moses representing the Law with the 10 Commandments, and Elijah representing the prophets. They died between 800 and 1000 years *before* Jesus, yet there they are alive again, conversing with the LORD. Where have they come from?

Even more, Peter is able to recognize who these figures are ... and he can even distinguish between them. "Rabbi, it is good that we are here!" Peter says to Jesus. "Let us build three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah" (Mark 9:5). Moses and Elijah have come from heaven; they are in the Father's presence. And by their appearing, they reveal to us more of what heaven is like.

In heaven, we will look like Moses, Elijah, and the LORD; we maintain our human appearance, only our bodies become "dazzling white." We retain our names, faces, bodies, and memories —evidenced by Peter's ability to see these men and recognize who they are. This is one of the great points of consolation for me as I not only ponder my own future, but also the reality of those whom I've loved and ministered to who've gone before me. Our memories persevere.

As we continue our Lenten journeys, may the consolation given on Mount Tabor remind us of why we're doing what we're doing – to live with the Lord and our loved ones forever.

St Pius has been supporting the Mother Teresa Soup Kitchen in Newark for decades. Every week trays of pasta are cooked and delivered to Newark to feed the hungry, the recent Sock Drive provided hundreds and hundreds of socks to warm the cold feet of the homeless, and recently, a group of high school parishioners served lunch to the men and women who were hungry at the kitchen. So many volunteers and generous parishioners make all this happen.

Recently, Sister Benedict, who leads Newark kitchen with many other incredibly dedicated sisters, is looking to provide a warm meal beyond the Soup Kitchen dining room. The intent is to directly serve meals to the community, to bring food to areas where the need is the greatest. To be able to carry out this mission, volunteers are requested to assist in handing out the food from the Soup Kitchen's van and/or to help package up the meals in individual containers. Volunteers are needed on Monday morning, monthly, and weekly to be determined. The time commitment would be from 8 to 11 am, give or take. The Kitchen itself is about 35 minutes away from SPX by means of major highways and parking is available and carpooling is certainly an option. It's not for everyone, yet a rewarding experience to feed the hungry where they live, to bring some joy to those in need.
