Dear Current and Future Loyola Flyer Families,

Thank you for the trust you place in Loyola College Prep and for choosing a Catholic education rooted in faith, tradition, and academic excellence. We are deeply grateful for your partnership as we work together to form young men and women of conscience, character, compassion, and service guided always by the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

At Loyola, our mission calls us not only to educate the mind, but also to nurture the heart and spirit. With that mission comes the ongoing responsibility to prayerfully and thoughtfully steward the resources entrusted to us. Each year, this includes the difficult but necessary task of reviewing tuition and fees to ensure we can meet the needs of our students, families, faculty, and campus.

For many years, tuition at Loyola has remained intentionally below the actual cost to educate a student. We do this to keep Loyola accessible to families who desire a four-year, faith-based, college preparatory education where students are known, challenged, supported, and where lifelong relationships are formed. The true cost of education would place Loyola beyond the reach of many families whose children enrich our community in countless ways. We are blessed to offset this gap through the generosity of alumni, parents, and community benefactors who recognize the lasting value of a Catholic education at Loyola.

After careful consideration and prayerful discernment, the Loyola Board of Directors has approved a 5% tuition increase for the 2026–27 school year. This decision reflects our effort to balance affordability with the continued growth, safety, and excellence of our academic and faith programs. The tuition and fee structure are outlined below:

Tuition	\$12,230
Building Fund Fee	\$500
Activity Fee *	\$550
Classroom/Textbook Fees	\$250
Total Tuition and Fees (All fees will be included in FACTS and can be spread over desired payment plans)	\$13,530

* Activity Fee Includes: Accident Insurance, Yearbook, Athletic Fee, Tech Fee, Student ID, Style Show, Parent Association Dues, and Campus Security

The Board of Directors worked with the Finance Committee to review tuition and fees in relation to the expenses, of which a majority of those expenses are personnel. Loyola has always tried to offer salary and benefits necessary to attract and retain faculty, which this increase will allow us to do. This increase also ensures that the school can continue to offer the best educational technology available to our students.

We fully recognize the financial sacrifice many families make in choosing Loyola. We believe, however, that this sacrifice is an investment in your child's future. Loyola graduates often enter college with significant dual-enrollment credit hours and are frequently awarded substantial scholarships, helping to reduce the overall cost of higher education.

Even with this adjustment, tuition and fees for the 2026–27 school year remain approximately \$4,400 below the actual cost to educate one student. We never want financial circumstances to prevent a student who desires a Loyola education from receiving one. For this reason, we continue to offer a range of financial assistance options and flexible payment plans. We encourage families to contact our Business Office at 318-226-6293, where our financial team will work diligently and confidentially with you to address your individual circumstances.

We will also continue to offer families the opportunity, during FACTS registration, to contribute the full cost of education if they are able and willing to do so. In past years, many Loyola families prayerfully chose this option, and their generosity was both humbling and inspiring. This contribution helps bridge the tuition gap for students in need, reflects our shared Catholic mission, and will be recognized as a tax-deductible donation. This option will remain available for the 2026–27 school year.

Thank you once again for your faith in Loyola College Prep, for your sacrifices, and for the countless ways you support our school community. Please keep Loyola in your prayers, as we promise to keep you and your student in ours. May God continue to bless our school and all who call it home.
