(1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Numbers 21:4-9 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: Philippians 2:6-11 Gospel: John 3:13-17)

### DID YOU KNOW

**Exaltation of the Holy Cross**, liturgical feast is celebrated on September 14<sup>th</sup> to honor the cross on which Jesus Christ was crucified. In the Eastern churches the feast dates back to the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre (the site of Christ's tomb) in Jerusalem (circa 335). It was adopted by the Roman Catholic Church in the 7<sup>th</sup> century and is also observed in various Protestant traditions, including Lutheranism and Anglicanism.

The universal symbol of the Christian faith, the cross, represents Christ's victory over death. The feast celebrates the redemptive transformation of a barbaric instrument of torture into a divine "**tree of life**" that brings hope to humankind. In some traditions, a cross is oriented to the cardinal directions to represent the universal nature of Christ's sacrifice and prayers are said for the salvation of all.

The **Exaltation of the Holy Cross** also commemorates the discovery of the **True Cross**. Legend holds that the relic was found by St. Helena, mother of Constantine the Great, during her pilgrimage to the Holy Land about 326. The Chapel of St. Helena inside the Church of the Holy Sepulchre was built by the Crusaders in her honor, and below it lies the Chapel of the Finding of the True Cross, in which the cross of Christ's crucifixion was reportedly discovered.

**True Cross**, Christian relic is reputedly the wood of the cross on which Jesus Christ was crucified.

The earliest historical references to veneration of the True Cross is found in works by doctors of the church and historians in the 4<sup>th</sup> century. In particular, St. Cyril of Jerusalem mentions relics of the True Cross in his Catecheses (c. 348). By the 8<sup>th</sup> century, church historian's accounts of the cross were enriched by legendary details describing the history of the wood before it was used for Jesus's crucifixion.

Adoration of the **True Cross** gave rise to the sale of its fragments, which were sought as relics. John Calvin pointed out that all the extant fragments, if put together, would fill a large ship. His objection was regarded as invalid by some Roman Catholic theologians, who claimed that the blood of Christ gave to the True Cross a kind of material indestructibility, so that it could be divided indefinitely without being diminished. Such beliefs resulted in the multiplication of relics of the True Cross wherever Christianity expanded in the medieval world, and fragments were deposited in most of the great cities and in a great many abbeys. Reliquaries designed to hold the fragments likewise multiplied, and some precious objects of this kind survive.

The desire to win back or obtain possession of the True Cross was claimed as justification for military expeditions, such as that of the Byzantine emperor Heraclius against the Persians (622-628) and the capture of Constantinople by the Crusaders in 1204.

The **Feast of the Finding of the Cross** was celebrated in the Roman Catholic Church on May 3<sup>rd</sup> until it was omitted from the church calendar in 1960 by Pope John XXIII. Veneration of the True Cross endures, however. The **Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross** is celebrated on September 14<sup>th</sup>. It commemorates St. Helena's finding of the cross as well as the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre (the site of Christ's tomb) in Jerusalem (c. 336) and the return of the cross after it was captured by the Persians.

In 2023 fragments of the relic were donated by the Holy See to King Charles III of the United Kingdom as a gift on the occasion of Charles's coronation. The fragments were placed inside the Cross of Wales, a processional cross of the Anglican Church in Wales that was used to lead the king into Westminster Abbey for the coronation ceremony.

### CHURCH TODAY

Pope Leo XIV is set to preside at a prayer service to remember the many Christians of our time who have been killed on account of their faith in Christ.

The Holy Father will be joined by representatives of other Christian Churches and ecclesial communities for an "Ecumenical Commemoration of Martyrs and Witnesses of the Faith of the Twenty-first Century," which will take place on the **Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, Sunday, September 14<sup>th</sup>**, in the Papal Basilica of St. Paul's Outside the Walls.

The Commemoration is an initiative of the Dicastery for the Causes of Saints and its Commission of New Martyrs, Witnesses to the Faith, which was established in 2024 by Pope Francis "to identify the Witnesses of the Faith in the first quarter century and to continue it into the future."

Speaking to members of the Ecumenical Joint Working Group of the Catholic Church and the World Council of Churches, the prefect of the Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity, Cardinal Kurt Koch, said the commemoration "will give visible expression to the conviction that the Church is already one in the blood of her martyrs."

#### **Preserving Memory**

At a press conference presenting the Commemoration, the President of the Commission of New Martyrs, Archbishop Fabio Fabene, described the work, saying that their research "has embraced all Christian denominations, since the vitality of baptism unites all Christians who gave their lives," and adding, "thus is realized the 'ecumenism of blood', as St. John Paul II liked to call martyrdom."

"The Church is already united," Archbishop Fabio Fabene continued, "and Pope Leo in turn hope that the blood of these martyrs will be **a seed of peace, reconciliation, fraternity, and love.**" The Archbishop added, "The Commission's work of documentation is meant to ensure these stories are not lost, but preserved in memory."



**VATICAN NEWS**  
**POPE: MAY CRY OF PEOPLE SUFFERING**  
**IN WAR RISE AS TRUSTING PRAYER TO GOD**

As he greeted pilgrims at the Wednesday General Audience, Pope Leo XIV asked for prayers and humanitarian projects on behalf of children suffering in places torn by war.

**"Remember in your prayers and humanitarian projects the children of Ukraine, Gaza, and other regions of the world afflicted by war,"** he said.

Speaking to Polish pilgrims, the Pope recalled the National Day of Polish Victims of War, which commemorates the suffering of children and their contribution to the reconstruction of Poland after World War II.

"I entrust you and the children who are suffering today to the protection of Mary, Queen of Peace," added the Pope.

Pope Leo also prayed for everyone enduring the turbulent situation in the Middle East, as he greeted the Arabic-speaking faithful.

"I invite you to transform your cry in moments of trial and tribulation into a trusting prayer, because God always listens to his children and responds at the moment he deems best for us," he said.
