A Message from Fr. David...

Christmas Joy







I was thinking of *A Charlie Brown Christmas*, which I saw so many times as a child. Recall the plot. Charlie Brown is depressed because of the commercialization of Christmas. In the climactic scene, Charlie Brown asks if anyone knows what Christmas is all about. Linus responds by recalling the announcement of Jesus' birth to the shepherds.

When Archbishop Vigneron wrote his letter *Unleash the Gospel*, he asked us to be able to describe the basic message of the Gospel, a message that is simple, radical, countercultural, and joyful. If someone asked you today what does it mean to be Christian or what is at the core of Christianity, what would you say? It could be asked in a different way on this day. Why is Christmas worthy of such celebration?

Here is the message of the Gospel broken down into four steps. (1) God is a loving God and out of a sheer act of generosity created all for us so that we would share in his goodness and eternal love. (2) Instead of loving God in return, we chose sin. Basically we chose to serve ourselves first rather than love God completely. This led to a rupture in our relationship that we could not repair. (3) The answer to our predicament is the Son of God takes on human flesh. He becomes one of us and by Jesus' cross and resurrection, he bridges the gap between us and God that had been due to sin. (4) This supreme gift has to be received personally by us. Jesus calls us to repent and gives us the sacraments and the Church as the means of becoming one with him. Let me plug The Rescue Project, which will be offered at St. Perpetua and Holy Spirit, as a way to further understand the basic Gospel message.

Why are we celebrating Christmas? Today we remember the first installment of the gift. As we see an image of Jesus in the arms of Mary we can think of the eloquent words of Pope Francis: "Jesus Christ loves you; he gave his life to save you; and now he is living at

your side every day to enlighten, strengthen and free you."

The Christ Child invites us to love him, believe him, and follow him just as a little baby invokes our response of love. We will find Jesus Christ in the times of darkness even when we are tempted to think he is not there. We will find him whenever we receive good news. We will find him when we see a new life. Archbishop Vigneron one time made an analogy. "Jesus is like meeting the person you are going to marry." If we open our heart to him we go forward not being able to imagine our life without him.

There is an image in scripture, "Behold, I stand at the door and knock" (Rev. 3:20). My hope today is that during the Christmas celebration, a word, a hymn, the decorated church, something will stand out and will be that invitation to let Jesus step in and completely transform your life going forward. Give him that chance. Open the door. Allow him to be your Savior and your God.

CSA Article for St. Patrick and St. Perpetua Bulletins

Contributing to CSA is better for St. Patrick and St. Perpetua than making a Christmas contribution.

But, let me explain why. CSA contribution is similar to a Christmas contribution in that both contributions are free of the usual 7% Diocesan Tax assessment. However, while an increasing Christmas contribution will result in a higher CSA target for the following year, an increasing CSA contribution has no impact on next year's CSA target.

Also, any money collected above the CSA target stays with the parish. Any shortfall in meeting the target must be made up by the parish, paying back the Archdiocese of Detroit with funds which have already been assessed the 7% Diocesan tax.

So, if you were planning to give something more for Christmas this year, think of giving that same money to the CSA. Your parish will be better off for it.

I once again thank you for your generosity to your parish.
