



A Message from Fr. David...

Happy New Year





I have said several times how much I like listening to Fr. Mike Schmitz's *The Bible in a Year* podcast and *The Catechism in a Year* podcast. I have never read the catechism as one reads a book. Certainly, I am familiar with it, but I got a lot out of this little refresher every day. I have been listening to Fr. Mike for three years, and I am considering listening to the Bible again. There is seemingly something new every time you read or listen to Scripture.

This has me thinking. As we begin the new year, what other good habits can we pursue as Catholics? I was edified to see all the support that we give to others at this time of year. Feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, giving shelter to the homeless, these are all corporal works of mercy. "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me," Jesus says. God will not be outdone in generosity. It is now a good time to think about and set goals for how to serve Jesus in others throughout the upcoming year. This reminds me of the fifth precept of the Church, taking care of the material needs of the Church, and in serving the poor, we are definitely taking care of her needs.

The first precept of the Church is our attendance at Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation. How is that going? If we have that very good habit down, I invite you to one of the daily Masses during the week. That is an excellent source of extra grace. How much of the Mass do I need to be at? I get asked that from time to time. The answer is we are supposed to be present from the sign of the cross until the blessing at the end. Perhaps if we are chronically late, a good goal would be to get to church in plenty of time to prepare ahead of time prayerfully.

Back to the catechism. The last part of the catechism is on prayer. How did we do with prayer in 2023? What is a good goal for 2024? Is there enough quiet time with the Lord each day? We have an adoration chapel in our Family at Holy Spirit, and we are in need of adorers. Can you spare one hour each week to pray in silence to Jesus? Perhaps if not that, it could be the Rosary. So many times I speak to people and I find out they are wanting to pick up this good practice again. Now is a great time.

Right before prayer in the catechism are listed the Ten Commandments. Are there any vices or addictions that you want out of your life? Pray for God's grace. Ask the intercession of the Blessed Mother. One good practice is to make a regular confession. When was the last time you were to confession? Also, an examination of conscience is a great way to end the day. We ask for God's mercy, and the grace to be a better Christian the next day. You can join me on the St. Patrick Facebook page as I pray Night Prayer at 9:00 each Tuesday and Thursday.

These were a couple of thoughts that I had. I hope that 2024 is a blessed year for you in that it is a year of growing in grace and coming closer to God.

As I mentioned at the beginning of December, the Christmas season lasts for one more week until the Baptism of the Lord, January 8, 2024. The world has already moved on from Christmas, but we continue to celebrate.

CSA Article for St. Patrick and St. Perpetua Bulletins

Contributing to CSA is better for St. Patrick and St. Perpetua than making a Christmas contribution.


But, let me explain why. CSA contribution is similar to a Christmas contribution in that both contributions are free of the usual 7% Diocesan Tax assessment. However, while an increasing Christmas contribution will result in a higher CSA target for the following year, an increasing CSA contribution has no impact on next year's CSA target.

Also, any money collected above the CSA target stays with the parish. Any shortfall in meeting the target must be made up by the parish, paying back the Archdiocese of Detroit with funds which have already been assessed the 7% Diocesan tax.

So, if you were planning to give something more for Christmas this year, think of giving that same money to the CSA. Your parish will be better off for it.

I once again thank you for your generosity to your parish.




