

Demographics

survey.

*We have 870 registered Parishioners.

*We average @ 500 people at mass on a weekend

*We had 345 surveys completed. This is 70% of the people attending Mass each weekend.

Demographics Based on the Survey Responses

~80% of responses live within 15 mins of the church.

~70% of responses have been parishioners more than 10 years (50% have been parishioners for more than 20 years)

~70% of responses attend Mass every week with another 15% attend Mass 2-3 times a month.

~86% of responses were raised as Roman Catholic.

~58% of responses are female and 39% are Male. (3% chose not to answer this question)

~16% of responses were adults with children

~Based on the survey responses we only have 62 kids under the

~60% of responses are retired and 26% are full time employees.

~75% of responses live without children (53% are couples with no children and 22% are adults living alone)

~90% of responses are over 50 years old. (45% of these are over 70 years old)





What to Take Up During Lent



At this time of year, I often refer to a book, The Spirituality of Fasting by Msgr. Charles Murphy. He relates a story. A woman married a laboring man at a young age, and because of the rigorous nature of his work, the family was exempt from fasting. Her husband died when she was over the age of sixty; we are no longer obliged to fast. She bragged that in her entire lifetime, she never fasted. Monsignor draws us to the conclusion that her legalism prevented her from seeing the spiritual value in fasting.

Strictly speaking, there are only two days on the calendar on which those over 18 until the beginning of their sixtieth year are obliged to fast, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. While fasting we are permitted one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

I am reminded of what Matthew Kelly said in his book Rediscover Catholicism. He identified three major practical philosophies or out time, one of them being minimalism. "What is the least I can do?" Contrast that with something else in Monsignor's book, a letter from Elizabeth Ann Seton before she became Catholic. She noted that the Catholic family she stayed with never ate during the season of Lent until after the clock struck three. Another story I often think about.

Here is my conclusion. If on Fridays during Lent we give up meat, but indulge in so many different ways, we are missing something. "Yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning" (Joel 2:12). One of the reminders for the season of Lent that we hear on Ash Wednesday is "Repent and believe in the Gospel." Repentance is a recognition that there is some area of my life that is not given wholeheartedly to God. It is a doing something

concrete to give that area back to God. It really can only be done if we give something over to God that we need. That is different than giving over to God the niceties that we can easily do without. We are meant to be hungry during Lent for Lent to be fruitful. When we give up something we need, we create a hole in ourselves. We are saying what I most need is God. Although I do not fully endorse Exodus 90, I have found some of the ascetical practices to be quite appropriate for Lent.

Another thing I have been reflecting on is an old article about Pope Francis. "Don't use God as a cover for injustice." Fasting is important. It must be accompanied by almsgiving. Pope Francis urges us to practice charity. How during this Lent are we going to reach out to those in need?

I should say something about prayer. We should increase our prayer during Lent. I looked up what our bishops say about Lent. They urge self-imposed fasting. They also urged us to participate in daily Mass. I know that is not possible for those work. If you are retired, I invite you to begin the day with Mass. Perhaps it is stopping at church each day. Do remember that the Family has an adoration chapel at Holy Spirit? It could be the Rosary. Please do not forget Stations of the Cross on Friday.

I pray that you have a great Lent, and I pray that you will be inspired to take on some new practices this year that will bring you closer to God during this wonderful season.


